Our team played well despite the absence of Alan Davies, Bernard Ganley and Frank Pitchford, their deputies must be congratulated in making the match one of the best of the season. The fact that John Noon played was a surprise and shows the sporting spirit of this player. John was having heat treatment up to leaving Oldham, for an injured back and with the rest of the team graced themselves with a game to be remembered.

We note with pleasure the good form shown by Jack Pycroft and he has fitted into the scheme of things very well. When we signed this player on through the injury to Frank Pitchford, the Warrington Club were hesitating about fixing Pycroft up and we were only just in time to get his transfer from Leeds. No doubt that Jack Pycroft is a decided acquisition to our playing staff.

**OUR VISITORS**

Today we have welcome visitors from Whitehaven, one of the outposts of the Rugby League. We hope to complete the double over our opponents, having won the match at Whitehaven on Saturday, 26th November, 1960 by 16 points to 2 points, this being one of our rare victories on the Whitehaven ground. However, we cannot afford our visitors lightly as only last Saturday they achieved a splendid victory at Hull by 23 points to 14 points, a no mean feat, and it will behove our players to show their best to overcome these dour Cumbrians. The Whitehaven Club are mid way in the League table having played 30 matches, won 14, drawn 1 and lost 15, scoring 377 points for against 380.

## NEW PLAYERS

Much has been said and very little business done regarding the acquisition of new players at Watersheddings. There is an old saying money talks all languages but then one cannot buy success, only on very rare occasions. The committee at Watersheddings are always on the look-out for new players, not only to strengthen the team but for replacements. Players who have attained international or county status are in great demand if they come on to the transfer list and they are not the only players who are demanding high fees. Quite recently, this club took a look at a second row forward playing with a Yorkshire Cub, and there were possibilities about this player which might have developed or otherwise, but at the present time we have young forwards in the same class in our "A" team. To ask the price came the reply £5,000 to £6,000 and the club is urgently in need of money but there was no harm in asking such an exorbitant fee. The high fees asked for players now-a-days is fantastic and is not in keeping with the revenue that the game produces as a spectacle, in most cases. One must not forget that the player of the future is a junior somewhere today. It is obvious that certain teams are rearing their own players by the running of a Colts team and if one or two players are secured in a season the time and money expended will be very well rewarded. Only nine Clubs have indicated that they wish to enter a Colts team in a proposed League sponsored by the Northern Rugby Football League for next season. They are Oldham, Hull, Leigh Hull K. R., St. Helens, Featherstone, Hunslet, Huddersfield and Wigan. Of course this League is to come into being if nine clubs are prepared to take part and we sincerely hope that this will come into operation.

## INJURED PLAYERS

Taking the season throughout we have had a spate of injured players and the hoodoo still continues. Terry Ogden hopes to resume training for next season early in July. Shaun Quinlan, this is the most unlucky player and we have seen too little of him during the season. A knee injury has been very persistent and when he resumed playing the other knee became damaged and he is at present in a Manchester Hospital, having been operated upon last Thursday for suspected ligament and cartilage trouble. We hope he makes a complete recovery and resumes playing next season.

Frank Pitchford has had a clearance certificate from a specialist to have a game in the 'A' team to test his damaged shoulder, and we hope he comes through the test successfully.

## WE MUST NOT LOSE GROUND

writes Cyril Briggs

The announcement that the New Zealand R.L. tourists to this country next Autumn may open their programme with a match under the Bloomfield Road lights of the Blackpool Soccer Club has many interesting aspects.

If the scheme goes through and the weather is favourable, Rugby League could receive one of its biggest ever boosts on the Fylde coast.

When the New Zealanders were over here for their last tour, the same venue was used by the Blackpool Borough club and on that occasion there were close on 20,000 people to see an epic struggle which resulted in a draw.

The Borough club and the game in general, could benefit by a floodlit match at Blackpool during the height of the holiday season, and it might mean another link in the broken chain between Lancashire, Furness and Cumberland clubs.

I have in mind the revival of a Lancaster or Morecambe club. I am sure that both these places could support a R.L. club and lend additional interest to the professional game in this part of Lancashire.

The R.L. Council must remember that Blackpool Borough must be kept in at all costs. The game had a set back in Lancashire when Belle Vue Rangers, a grand old club, were allowed to disband.

### NOT LOSING GROUND

In the past, Morecambe, Lancaster, St. Helens Rec. and Wigan Highfield have dropped out of the league, but, of course, there have been other clubs to replace them.

R.L. is not losing any ground. Attendances at Wigan, St. Helens and Swinton have been increasing of late and it was fully expected that there would be a record crowd at Central Park on Good Friday for the meeting of the Saints and Wigan. The whole of the stand accommodation had been sold weeks before and if there percentage of the gate goes into the League Pool it will help the poorer clubs.

Rugby League is not by any means losing ground at the moment.

There have been steady increases in various places because clubs have now realised that only the best entertainment will bring back the crowds. At Swinton things are going very well indeed. So well in fact that the gates have risen to 12 per cent above last years totals.

This is most encouraging when Swinton have to face competition from the two Manchester Soccer clubs and also Bolton, Leigh are now recording 5,000 to 7,000 spectators, for their reserve team matches.

Of course, this big rise has resulted from the signing of four South Africans and also Bev. Risman the English R.U. half back or three-quarter.

From headquarters too comes good news. Already tickets valued at £22,000 have been sold for the Wembley cup final on May 13th.

It could also be a record here. Another £12,000 needs to be taken for ground tickets and then last year's record receipts for the final will have been surpassed.

It is not generally known that from cup final and league matches certain quotas are taken out of the gates so that lowly clubs can be helped. This season may be one of the best for the cup pool since the two leg system for the first round was dropped.

### HUGE FEES

And the huge fees which are being dangled before the eyes of South African, Scottish, Irish and Welsh R.U. players to switch to the professional game again shows that there is no lack of funds in certain parts of the R.L. world.

Personalities and more personalities are still required and next season may see the re-introduction of the 'Other Nationalities' team with a predominance of South African's in this side for the first time.

There are now 13 or 14 South Africans playing R.L. football and more are to follow. Now that Beverley Risman has cashed in on his talents it is quite possible that more R.U. stars will follow in his footsteps. The season is now drawing to a close but it could finish on a very interesting note.

A Wigan and St. Helens final at Wembley would be a corker and it looks as if it is going to be that way. Both teams are strongly favoured to win their semi-final ties and huge gates will be the order of the day on April 15th.

The league final on May 20th should also attract a 75,000 crowd at Odsal. Who will be the competitors? It is as difficult to guess as selecting the winner of one of the big horse races.
