Young Bill had previously scored a brilliant 40 yard try, to reduce Huddersfield's 7 pts. lead.

Despite playing behind a weakened pack, our half-backs, Skeels and Fallon, caused the home side quite a deal of trouble.

Huddersfield's final score of 5 goals and 3 tries to 1 try was described by the national press as flattering.

Bill Burgess travelled back to Preston on Thursday, and though complaining of a severe headache, rang up to say he would be fit to be provisionally considered for to-day's game.
