There are a host a young players who could in quick time become familiar stars. Possibly on the verge of first team success is centre ALAN FOX, a lively and intelligent player who unluckily fractured his collar bone two years ago.

Some critics maintain that by the time a player reaches professional standard he should be beyond the need for coaching. That may be true with ready-made stock but the know-how training remains of paramount importance for these juniors — many of whom only play on a decent rugby field when they achieve professional status.
