Assistant Secretary's Notes

I sincerely hope that Bryn makes a success of this job, and at this juncture thank "Pitchy" for his part in this similar position last season, although I personally thought the responsibility of player and coach was affecting his play, particularly towards the end of the season.

In conclusion, I wish the Club, Players and Committee, a successful season in 1962/63, and hope that the spectators will rally round and support what I hope will be a winning side.



He was most popular and respected during his term of office. Not only did he coach the Queensland state team, he also helped to select it. He was greatly respected by the New South Wales Rugby League, the traditional enemy of his own state.

Alan Laird, who played in the Oldham side about the war period, returned to his native land, New Zealand, where he became an Auckland provincial representative. Alan was chosen for the New Zealand team which toured Australia in 1948. He did not appear in Test football, being unfortunate in being a contemporary of Trav Hardwick who held the loose forward position so long for the Kiwis.

Our latest emigrant, Arthur Tomlinson, who played so hard and so well for the Cherry and Whites, was granted a clearance to play in New Zealand. He played so well that he was selected to coach the New Zealanders to play the 1962 British tourists. Ces Mountford, who was confidently predicted would be chosen, was passed over in favour of Arthur.

Over the years we have had Anlezark, the Farnsworths, Deane, G. W. Smith and many others who crossed the world to play at Watersheddings. If ever the ban is lifted on signings from down under we might have more great players from Australia and New Zealand to grace our colours.



Rugby League in South Africa

by TOM WEBB

The Rugby League game has made a big impact in South Africa where Rugby is by far the most important sport in the country. Over the last few years, a growing awareness of the thirteen-a-side game has brought outbursts from the Rugby Union leaders, and in spite of this, interest has grown until two distinct bodies set up their own organisations to develop the game as a commercial proposition.

The fact that England took the cream of the nation's players made the Rugby players of South Africa interested in Rugby League. Tom Van Vollenhoven, Ron Colin, Jan Prinsloo and Alan Skene are four men whose names are household words where Rugby Football is discussed. Others have had, or are still having careers in Rugby League in this country, while others have returned to continue playing Rugby League in their own country.

Attendances at matches vary. Five thousand, four thousand, seven hundred and fifty, are attendances variously reported by the newspapers. This in spite of the fact that the best grounds are under the control of the Rugby Union game. Should an international Rugby League side undertake a four of South Africa on the lines of the present tour of Australia and New Zealand, then I am sure that the game would grow by leaps and bounds.

In country districts of New South Wales and Queensland, international tours bring such glamour that match days against the British sides are declared to be public holidays. Rugby League has thrived under these conditions.

Australian Rugby Union was once the supreme game, but the Rugby League has made such tremendous advances that the fifteen a side game is a very poor competitor, and visiting touring teams play far more games in New Zealand than in Australia, an admission by the powers that be in Rugby Union that the game is declining in the land of the Kangaroo.

The position is not the same in South Africa, but once tours are arranged by Great Britain, France, Australia and New Zealand to the newly developing leagues of that country, then progress will indeed be rapid.

In a few year's time we will be seeing Johannesburg Celtic, Western Province and similar clubs becoming as famous as Wigan, Warrington, Leeds, Oldham or even Sydney St. George. IF IT'S

Roundup

Six months' hard labour . . . that's how someone summed up my first spell as Oldham Chronicle Rugby League critic.

For since I started to watch Oldham at the start of this year, the team have had a hit-and-miss run of form that has seen them soaring to success one week and zooming to the depths the next.

But this, for me, has been no sentence. Indeed, I have had the pleasure to watch a new Oldham take shape, slowly and, admittedly not always surefooted, under the guiding hand of Frank Pitchford.

It is a slow process that, I am sure, will have its reward next term in the scramble for glory in two division football.

But that is all in the future — and pudding to eat at this time next year. The job now is to look back and try to analyse the reasons for a season's lapses that saw Oldham so near to Cup and League success and at the same time so far away.

I can only concur the reasons given by the parent club president, Mr. Bill Howard, when he lays the blame at coaching upsets, thrown-away games and a glut of injuries to key players at vital periods.

All teams go through bad patches and Oldham are no exception. But, and this is the lesson that has been learned, provision should and must be made for incidents of this nature.

Oldham's main objective now is to build a team that can carry the club to the successes of the 1950's. It can be done. At Watersheddings now there is the basis of a good club. There are star players, there are promising players, there are players ready and able to step into first team football.

All must be nursed along. All must be given their chance when the occasion and their form indicates. And, in this respect, team selection should be ruthless.

Already Pitchford's coaching and tactics are improving the standard of football.

For you, the supporter, there is also a task. It is all right to sit back and say "When the team improves, we'll start going again." The team can't improve until you start going. Players cannot be bought on overdrafts. It's your money that makes your team. And good teams cannot be built on 8,000 crowds.

Oldham have sound roots right through the club, from playing staff to administration. Give them time, and your support, and success will be just around the proverbial corner.

Lastly, I would like to end on a personal note by thanking the many people in Oldham — supporters, officials and others — who have already made my wife and myself welcome to the town.
