



### OFFICIAL NOTES

These notes are having to be written before the game against Whitehaven. Naturally, I hope the result was in our favour, any other will have been a big disappointment to us, and could seriously affect this afternoon's gate.

The result of the cup game against Workington was disappointing, but it must be remembered that our lads put up a good show against strong first division opposition. I daresay they will probably play much worse, and yet win, against weaker teams. The season is very early yet to make comparisons, but although at the time of writing we have had only two home games, I was tempted to compare them with last year's corresponding matches. Once again, as I write these notes, what is news to-day may be stale by Monday, but it seems possible that our winger, Tony Wilkshire, may have moved to a new club, for two Lancashire clubs had opened negotiations. It was most unfortunate that Ged Hall should be suspended for alleged hooking offences so early in the season, for with Eddie Bowden only recently resuming training and not quite match fit, it meant we were in a spot, but we are fortunate in possessing such a versatile player as Billy Knowles to step into the breach, there is no better club man anywhere than Bill, he will play in any position he is called upon to do, first or second team, and without a grumble, younger players please note; and why? Simply because he loves his rugby. With him the game's the thing, and you can be guaranteed a 100 per cent. effort.

Although our new ground is by no means finished, we have had a lot of praise, expecially from the press boys, about it. The Lancashire Evening Post stated "Blackpool Borough's enterprise has shocked the Rugby League. The opening of their new palatial ground at Borough Park is the talking point in official circles."
