ATTENDANCES

One has only to look at the weekend papers to notice the alarming decrease in attendances at Rugby League matches. It is, indeed, a rarity to find a 'gate' of over 10,000 nowadays and one wonders where the patrons of the past have gone. Has the game gone back as a spectacle, can it be improved by the re-introduction of the tap penalty and so obviate that objectionable offside business. Are the players wages too high, so that it is to win at any cost. There can be a multiple amount of causes and it is time that clubs did some deep thinking to brighten our game and bring the paying customers back.

In the 4 league games we have played at Watersheddings, the average paying customers amount to 4,540. This is not sufficient to keep a club of our standing going. As with other clubs, we are relying on a subsidy by way of the Pools Organisation, but this cannot possibly last for ever. Every section of any organisation must be self supporting, otherwise a court of enquiry should be held as to why, and the position rectified. Of course, like the poor who are always with us, there are bound to be some clubs more affluent than other and always will be, but that does not stop our game from attracting more spectators than it does. We all like crowing at what a great game we have in Rugby League, and so we have when played correctly, but why is it losing its attractiveness to draw the crowds, that is what we want to know and the position rectified.
