Rochdale Hornets and Leigh in both leagues, so that in a fixture list of 34 games Oldham play 16 games against only four clubs, surely nobody considers this an ideal arrangement.

The problem is how can we have 2 divisions and give everybody a full fixture list and make the competition fully competitive and interesting for everybody. I think a good fixture list is one of 38 matches plus cup ties of which every club has at least 2 games. So the two leagues should consist of 15 teams in each league, each team to play all other teams in its own league, that gives each team 28 games, the other ten games would be played by dividing each league into 3 groups of five teams in each group.
