

WATERSHEDDINGS NEWS AND VIEWS

Disappoinment after disappointment in our failure to reach Wembley for the first time, after we had expected so much from our team. The Challenge Cup rounds this season have been tense and exciting to us, and to win away at Keighley, at home against a strong Featherstone team, and away again at Hunsiet, was very encouraging, so much so that we fully expected to be beat Hull Kinston Rovers in the semi-final, but after two drawn games, we lost the third, on a day when we must admit we were beaten by a better team. Our lads on that day did not excel themselves as in the previous rounds and we retired beaten by 12 points to 2 points. So near to Wembley, we fell at the last hurdle. When one looks back at the semi-final games and remembers the thrills and excitement from start to finish, one can't understand why our game is in such a sorry state, for these games proved that if it is played in the right spirit and according to the book then the people will turn up in their thousands to watch.

Our progress in the Challenge Cup aroused the Rugby League public of Oldham, and the application for tickets was tremendous, so much so, that we could not satisfy all requirements, we hope the spirit will now remain and that you will support us in our efforts to produce nothing but the best at Watersheddings.

Last week the Committee sent to the Widnes Club a message of congratulation on the club reaching Wembley for the fifth time. Widnes will represent Lancashire at Wembley on May 9th against our victors in the semi-final, and we wish them the best of luck.
