



OUR GAME

Many times we are apt to think and say things pessimistically about our game, but we consider the game is alright, it is the people that are in it, both as legislators and players, that make it what it is. If played in the right spirit it will draw the crowds, but if it is put over with a lack of spirit and willingness by the players, thus failing to give value for money to the spectators, then as a spectacle it is discounted very heavily.

Take the three games we have played against Hull Kingston Rovers in the Challenge Cup semi-final. Could anyone wish for a finer display of Rugby League than these matches produced? Our first match at Leeds was put over on live television, and we have received compliments from all over England on the rugby produced.

Facts and figures speak for themselves when the following attendances and receipts for the three matches are given:-

At Leeds—Attendance 28,556—Receipts £7402

At Swinton-Attendance 27,209-Receipts £5900

At Huddersfield—Attendance 32,757—Receipts £6200

The average attendance being 29,507 and average receipts £6,300

One will notice the great difference in the receipts in comparison to the attendance, and this can be accounted for by the difference in the charges of admission and the number of stand seats available for sale. We think that all prices of admission should be uniform, whatever ground the matches are played on.

CONCLUSION

This being the last second division league match of the season, we wish to extend, firstly to our members and patrons, our thanks for supporting us in our first season of second division football. We have emerged as champions of the division and this evening our team will be presented with the championship trophy and medals by the Chairman of the Management Committee, Mr. J. Edden of the Swinton Club. Mr. Edden will be best remembered as a first class referee and was the official in charge of the third Wembley Final in 1931, between Halifax and York. Now a director of the Swinton Club, Mr. Edden is now a very capable legislator of the Rugby League and as previously stated is Chairman of the Management Committee. May we also offer thanks to the advertisers in the match programme, for with their assistance the programme is kept down in cost, we hope that they have been amply repaid for the confidence in their advertisements in our journal.
