Let us all stop going to the wailing wall, climb to the top of the wall and you will see on the horizon a brightness that can be achieved by honesty of purpose and a sense of duty to the organisation one represents.

One has only to cast one's memory back to our own game against Hunslet on January 2nd, what was wrong with that game? Although the match attracted only just over 4,000 spectators (weather conditions being adverse), every person was well satisfied with the show of Rugby League given by our team. Let us all stop running our game down, it is a great game if played according to the rules. Many times one hears we have the finest game in the world, and so it is, let the knockers go somewhere else to give vent to there feelings, as there is no room for them in Rugby League football.

We consider that the Salford team are one of the most improved teams in the Rugby League, thanks to the advent of their new manager, our old friend Griff Jenkins.
