## CLUB NOTES

Today we have our third home game in succession. After our great win over Featherstone we are hoping for continued success at the expense of Oldham.

After a few indifferent displays, last Saturday our boys showed that with a bit of luck they can play football. For once the ball ran kindly for us and we took advantage of any error the Rovers incurred.

With five changes, some positional and some through injury, our boys pulled out all the stops to register a very fine win. Both reserves who came in had good games and one or two of the senior players had their best games of the season.

This week's visitors from the Watersheddings, Oldham, will be out to register a double. In winning 26-6 at Oldham they showed that they are a very good side.

Oldham are a club who seem to be in the transfer news fairly regularly, either making a signing or selling a player, and one of their best signings must be Frank "Spanky" Dyson, their player/coach who was signed from Huddersfield two years ago. The main news on the home front is of Harry Street as coach for next season. As we stated in the press, Harry Street will begin his duties at the end of this season for two seasons. Harry was well-known as a player with Castleford, Dewsbury, Wigan, Leeds and Featherstone and toured Australia in 1950. He later turned to coaching and his results at Castleford were shown to full effect at Lawkholme a few weeks ago. Everyone at Lawkholme wishes Harry the best of luck in his stay here.

Gary Owen, our present player/coach, has already stated that he will continue to play again next season.

Congratulations to Les Thomas and Brian Gaines. These two youngsters have been picked to play for England Under 24's against France on April 3rd at Toulouse.

Since signing from Maesteg only five months ago, Les has improved every week and his inclusion at right centre has made all at Keighley very proud.

Brian Gaines has not been able to command a regular place this season but he is thought to have a good future in the game.
