

OLDHAM v. BLACKPOOL

OUR VISITORS

This evening we entertain the Blackpool Club and give them a welcome to Watersheddings. This match should have been played on December 12th last but was postponed owing to the waterlogged state of the ground. We visited Blackpool in the early part of the season and won an evenly contested game by 13 points to 10 points. The Blackpool Club are keeping the flag flying on the coast and their directors must be complimented on their enterprise and faith in the Rugby League, and for the fine ground and enclosure they have built at Rigby Road, Blackpool. They possess a super modern stand and the appointments under the stand are a credit to the Club. Although not enjoying the best of seasons, having played 27 matches, won 5, drawn 2 and lost 20, scoring 217 points against 454 points. However, their players can put up a good show, as was evident by their displays of the Challenge Cup competition. We give a special welcome to Roger Dufty, one of our ex players, who is skipper of the side and who appears to be in fine condition. After a period of service with Barrow, he joined the Metropolitan Police at Twickenham, but the game of Rugby League was still in Roger's blood and he eventually secured a transfer to the Blackpool Borough Police, who granted the necessary permission for him to play professional Rugby League football.

'A' TEAM FOOTBALL

The number of times we have written and complained about the lack of interest taken by clubs and other people in authority has always fallen on stoney ground.

Now comes along a request and which has been granted, for a transfer owing to the lack of fixtures for 'A' teams and the continued 'unemployment' that is created. Apart from a personal view of keeping fit it is most annoying for a player to come training each Tuesday and Thursday and then to find that their is no game on the Saturday, an odd occasion must arise now and then, but to continue for a period of four to five weeks is just beyond any sense of reason. One must not forget that the large majority of players who constitute the 'A' teams are professional Rugby League players and to continue working for the club by way of training and no financial reward is what we may call an un-British way of life.

The application for transfer of Bill Patterson, always a good club man and consistent trainer, has been granted and may we say regretfully, but then again these boys must have their game of Rugby League, hence the club's decision to release him.
