WELCOME TO OLDHAM

After a break last year when Oldham were in the Second Division we are happy to return to our long established Good Friday meeting with our friends from Oldham. Like ourselves, they have also played a match already this week, for when we were at Liverpool on Tuesday they were at home to Salford. These notes were written prior to Tuesday's matches and so we can make no comment on them.

We have printed a League table in today's programme, which includes results up to and including last Saturday. This has been taken from one of the few newspapers which managed to get our League record correct. The Saturday Evening sports papers and some of Sundays' papers managed to give us an extra defeat, and so clip two points from our total.

Oldham would appear to have a chance of finishing in the top eight providing they win their remaining games. Tomorrow they travel to Whitehaven, a journey we had to make on the same day last season, and they complete their programme with a visit from Dewsbury to Watersheddings on Monday. After playing Tuesday and today, we certainly don't envy them the long trip through the Lake District to play Whitehaven.

In the game at Oldham which was played early in the season we were defeated by 13 points to 2. Frank Dyson kicking five goals in this game. Now Oldham have signed Winton from Wigan, to join his former colleagues McCormack and McLeod, who had previously been transferred from Wigan to Oldham. A popular member of the Oldham team today will be our former player, Peter Smethurst.

It is likely that changes may be necessary in our team; on Tuesday we were without Ken Gowers, who was troubled with septic and Alan Buckley with influenza. Derek Whitehead was injured in the match at Oldham last Saturday and will not be fit

for any of the holiday matches, and Frank Hutton was to have treatment at Huddersfield Infirmary today for a broken nose which he sustained against Blackpool Borough. Warren Jenkins, who injured an ankle against Blackpool is doubtful but we are hoping that Ken and Alan will have recovered.
