This will only be achieved if the players play attractive football and not the 'head down' rugby we have witnessed and read about far too often in 1965.



The rush to buy Christmas presents no doubt hit the gate, although the inclement weather and the doubt in a number of people's minds as to whether the match would be played certainly created havoc with the gate.

CHRISTMAS DRAW, 1965




