SWINTON versus OLDHAM

WELCOME TO OLDHAM

This afternoon we welcome our old friends from Oldham in the First Round of the Challenge Cup. Our last meeting in this Competition was in the Final of 1927, when Oldham won by 26 points to 7. This was at a period when appearances in the final were quite a habit with both teams. Oldham playing in four successive finals in 1924, 1925, 1926 and 1927, and Swinton in the Finals of 1926, 1927 and 1928. Oldham were also finalists in 1899, 1907 and 1912, while Swinton's other appearances were in 1900 and 1932.

It is strange that Swinton have always won the Cup the year following an Oldham victory, as the results given below show.

- 1899. Oldham 2 goals 5 tries 19 pts. Hunslet 3 goals 1 try 9 pts.
- 1900. Swinton 2 goals 4 tries 16 pts. Salford 1 goal 2 tries 8 pts.
- 1925. Oldham 2 goals 4 tries 16 pts. Hull K.R. 1 try 3 pts.
- 1926. Swinton 3 goals 1 try 9 pts. Oldham 1 try 3 pts.
- 1927. Oldham 4 goals 6 tries 26 pts. Swinton 2 goals 1 try 7 pts.
- 1928. Swinton 1 goal 1 try 5 pts. Warrington 1 try 3 pts.

Two years ago Oldham reached the Semi-final of the Competition, and drew with Hull Kingston Rovers. In the replay at Swinton the result at the end of 80 minutes was a draw, and 30 minutes extra time should have been played. Unfortunately after 10 minutes

with Oldham in the lead by 3 points and looking well set for their first appearance at Wembley play was stopped because of darkness and the match replayed at Huddersfield. In the second re-play Oldham were defeated, and so were most unlucky not to play at Wembley. Last season in the First Round all four of the previous Semi-finalists were knocked out, Oldham losing to the eventual runners-up, Hunslet, by 12 points to 4.

Swinton supporters will be hoping that last year's semi-finalists do not suffer the same fate this time, for we reached that stage last year. After defeating Dewsbury Celtic in the First Round, we had wonderful victories at Featherstone and Warrington in the second and third rounds, respectively, and with high hopes of reaching the final played Wigan at St. Helens in the Semi-final.

However, our hopes were dashed, and Wigan caught us well below our best to win by 25 points to 10.

Both Oldham and Swinton are having successful seasons in the League programme and the records are as follows:—

Swinton, 3rd, P. 25; W. 19; D. 1; L. 5; For 375; Agst. 210. 39 pts.

Oldham, 9th; P. 24; W. 13; D. 3; L. 8; For 265; Agst. 276. 29 pts.

Stars of Oldham's recent successful run have been forwards Charlie Bott, Peter Smethurst, Dave Parker and Alan Burns, with half-backs Tom Warburton and Tom Canning also in excellent form. They have a first class goal kicker in full-back John Winton, the former Wigan player. Recent signing from Blackpool Borough Mick Mooney has added strength to the three-quarter line which will be selected from Geoff Sims, Jim McCormack, John Donovan and Trevor Simms. Former Leeds forward Stuart Whitehead is expected to be included in the second row, and the choice for hooker will be between Kevin Taylor and Graham Wood.

Our own team is from the 15 players who were successful at Warrington last Saturday.
