En route hooker John Lewis was taken ill and Derek agreed to 'hook' and won the scrums 18-1. Since then the hooking spot has more or less belonged to him.

In the second row, coach Gerry Helme will no doubt select the former Water-loo Rugby Union player Mick Murphy and Rugby League try scoring record holder, Mick Martyn. Completing the picture Stan Walmsley packs down at No. 13. Stan is a very sound player, a master of snatching loose balls.


