We warned you last week it would be necessary to look after whatever ground tickets you could find. Well the search is on. The allocation of tickets for the contesting teams is much too small whenever two good teams meet at Wembley, especially whenever these particular teams have a good following.

It is understandable that both the Rugby League and the Wembley authorities want to spread the tickets as widely as possible in case two teams without a good band of supporters get through to Wembley and the game should lack its usual attraction. But this may prove rather hard lines on the two finalists and their followers. If the people who have to allocate the tickets to clubs could just get into the middle of the pursuit of tickets, as it has happened at Wigan and St. Helens during the last week or two, they would be more than anxious to help out the struggling secretaries and officials.

So great has been the demand for tickets that each new parcel has been swallowed up as soon as they arrived and now it has been decided to issue the last 5,000 and make the maximum issue 100,000 just as for the Soccer Cup.

OLDHAM ON THE MOVE AGAIN

Workington at home seemed favourites for the second round of the "top sixteen", but Oldham who just got pipped for eighth place by Workington and had the disappointment of a long journey to Cumberland, have the opportunity of sharing a good gate at Knowsley Road.

Last Saturday was a red letter day for the Oldham captain, whose try just put his team into a one point lead. Workington scored three goals but found the Oldham defence on the whole too good.
