



It is hard to believe that Wigan have been out of touch because they possess many stars, none more than captain/coach Eric Ashton who has been battling


against a great deal of bad luck with injuries.

Wigan's half backs this evening will no doubt be Cliff Hill and Frank Parr. Cliff has been dogged with injuries so far this season and it is hoped that he now

has a little more luck . . . he deserves it.

The Wigan pack really needs no introduction at all except perhaps for Liverpool City's County player John Thompson who is on trial at Wigan and at present

Fletcher was again a tower of strength up front and is fast becoming one of the game's bright young forwards. He was well supported by the rest of the forwards.

We enter the final for the first time since 1958. On that occasion we triumphed against St. Helens at Central Park. Let us hope luck will be on our side and that we can recover that elusive Lancashire Cup for the first time in eight long years.
