
Organised by Whitbread & Co. Ltd. in association with The Rugby Football League



A lot of our own fans suspected a forward pass here but referee, Peter Geraghty, who it was thought had a good game, was right on the spot so we had no grumble. Stan McLeod would have been the toast of Oldham had he managed to score in the last seconds as he almost did. However the luck was not with us at the time so our boys, who had turned in a really wonderful show, had to be satisfied with runners-up medals.

Last week's game at Headingley was another disappointment when we lost by 21 points to 14. This game was packed with excitement and also some fine rugby particularly from the home side. NEW RULES SHAKE UP MACKESON TABLES BIG TUSSLE FOR PERIOD 2 TANKARDS

The advent of the Rugby League rule changes and consequent shock results in recent weeks has produced some violent ups-and-downs in the Mackeson tables.

In the Period 2 Contest, due to end with matches played on November 19, St. Helens look to be in danger of losing their once safe-looking lead. Their 29-5 plunge at Leigh leaves them top but with only a .36 lead over Hull K.R.

With Workington, out of the Mackeson prizes for the past two seasons, only a further .14 of a point behind, the odds on the destination of the tankards looks evenly balanced between the three Rugby League counties.

New leaders have also emerged in the Main Contest. Hull K.R. now go just ahead with 22.94 to Halifax's 22.93, with Leeds still a danger with 21.93.
