
Organised by Whitbread & Co. Ltd. in association with The Rugby Football League

August 6 to September 24 September 26 to November 19 November 21 to January 14 January 16 to March 11



RUGBY LEAGUE CUP FINAL

Owing to the higher rate of sale of Cup Final seating tickets this year, many regular patrons who applied late for their tickets have to be satisfied with Standing Enclosure tickets. When sending out tickets for any one Final, the Rugby League Secretary encloses an application form for the next Final. Regular patrons should make use of these forms at an early date, otherwise they have only themselves to blame if they fail to get tickets.

The Wembley authorities complain that supporters at the Rugby League Cup Final who are in the Standing Enclosure quite often insist on sitting down on the terraces. They ignore loudspeaker requests to stand, and thus cause congestion and annoyance to other ticket holders who are trying to gain admission to the enclosure.

Rugby League supporters are requested to take heed of the instructions which are broadcast on the special loudspeaker system, as these instructions are given in an endeavour to provide the minimum of inconvenience to all spectators.

Quite often supporters ask why "Abide with me" cannot be sung prior to the kick-off of the Rugby League Cup Final. The answer is that this song would seem to be the 'copyright' of the Soccer Final. It is up to the Rugby League to establish a song of their own. The Rugby League Secretary has been asking for suggestions as to what song could be accepted as the most likely climax to the community singing. "Onward Christian Soldiers" seems to be a popular choice. Any other suggestions are welcome. Once the final choice is made, every effort will be made to build it up into a suitable climax of the community singing.
