Mackeson Contest Review

At the Mackeson reception in Manchester following the 1966 League Championship Final, Mackeson Managing Director Dick Fanshawe concluded his speech with the quite formal announcement that the Mackeson Rugby League Contest would continue again in the 1966/67 season.

As organiser of the contest on behalf of Whitbread & Co. Ltd., I was delighted at the cheers which greeted Mr. Fanshawe's statement. What I did not expect — but which gave me even more pleasure — were the comments made afterwards by Rugby League officials, club directors and players alike.

"Surely the Mackeson contest was never in doubt" said one. And another: "The season wouldn't be the same."

These comments, and others like them, seemed to me to show how, in only four seasons, the Mackeson Rugby League Contest has become a part of the rugby league scene. A scene, may I say, in which we are very glad to be able to feature.

HIGHEST SCORE

The 1966 Main Contest trophy and 200 guinea cheque were clearly won by Wigan and the "Mackeson" certainly did perform a useful service in putting the club's season-long performances in proper perspective. We all know that, as a rule, Wigan and success go together, and to some it might seem just and proper that the League's official top awards should have gone elsewhere for a change.

But all this must have made the last minute exits from the Cup and the League Championships — and the attendant criticism — seem all the more harsh to Eric Ashton and his men. In Rugby League, it seems — as in show business — you are only as good as your last performance.

In fact, a look at the Mackeson tables shows that Wigan's performances last year were hardly those of "tired men." The only club topping the 700-mark with a final tally of 775 points in 44 matches for an average of 17.61. 17 times scoring over 20 points in a match, topping 30 on three occasions, twice running up more than 40 points and cracking in the season's highest score of 51 points.

MAGNIFICENT SEASON

Neither was their defence that bad. Wigan only conceded more than 20 points on five occasions. One of those was their League Championship semi-final exit at the hands of Halifax. The other was the Cup Final!

Wigan's final Main Contest lead over runners-up Wakefield Trinity (16.30) and Halifax (15.44) had hardly looked certain earlier in the season. In January and February the top four placings were

constantly juggled by Wigan, Wakefield, Castleford and St. Helens, with rarely as much as two points between them.

St. Helens finished their magnificent season only .02 of a point behind Halifax whilst Castleford eventually fell away to fifth place having only scored just over 10 points per match in their final eight games.

BRIGHT START

The five subsidiary contests again gave an interesting side-light on performances at different periods of the season — and threw up some very surprising results. St. Helens, for instance, sweeping all before them in League and Cup, not only failed to win a single set of tankards but never finished a period in the top four!

Then there were clubs who achieved high scoring at times but failed to maintain consistency over the season as a whole. Hull Kingston Rovers topped the first period table with 20.50 but finished Period 2 in 22nd place with an average of 8.86 before climbing back to fifth place in the final session. Workington's bright start with second and seventh placings in the first two periods followed by a sudden slump to 26th position in period 3.

And such disappointment as Warrington's continued inability to get among the points, culminating (if that is the word) in an average of 5.10 points per game in their last ten matches to finish in 29th place.

After Hull K.R. had taken the first flag of the season came the first leg of Wigan's double in periods two and four. Period 2 gave Wigan a very clear win over Castleford with the season's top winning average of 22.86. Period 4 only went the Central Park way on the final day with Wigan just leaving month-long leaders Featherstone stranded in second place.

TALKING POINT

In between these events came Wakefield Trinity's storming mid-season win in Period 3 ahead of Widnes, Bradford Northern and Swinton. Odd to reflect that these last three have never yet won a section of the contest in all four years!

Finally came Halifax in Period 5 with the late-season run that earned them flag and tankards and only fell short of the League Championship itself.

So to the new season when we hope the Mackeson Contest will continue to prove an added incentive to players, a stimulus to brighter play, and a talking point on the terraces.

Which club will consistently score the 17½-plus points per match necessary to win the main trophy? Will the Mackeson flag fly over new grounds, such as the Boulevard, Fartown, Wilderspool, Odsal or Naughton Park? Or will some of the previous winners expand their tankard collection?

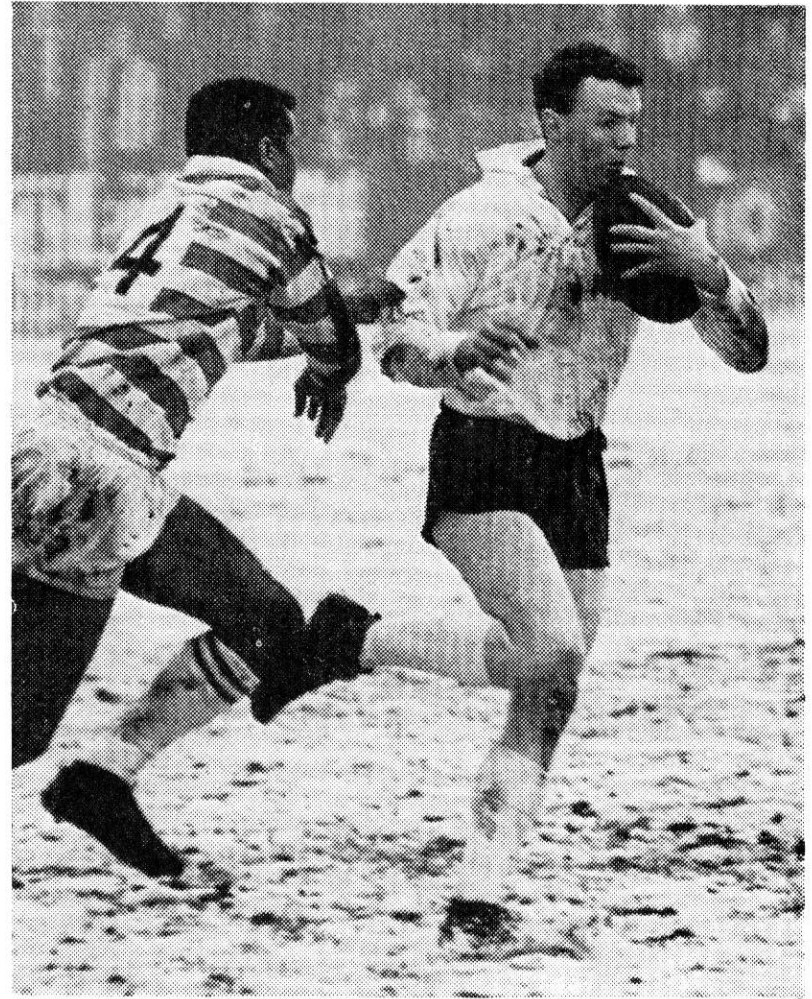

Time To Take Stock

By the time this handbook is on sale, season 1965/66 will be almost forgotten. The balance sheet, which went out to members last May, will be just a bad dream. In fact, thoughts will have turned to the new season with hopes of success and, if I dare mention it, I believe that the coming year may at last see Oldham engaged in a long Challenge Cup run.

Hopes are all very well. But they must be tempered with logical thinking and, frankly, there will have to be plenty of action . . . on the right lines, too . . . if the crowds are to pack Watersheddings regularly once again.

The new committee is now in power. In their hands lie the destinies of a famous club which, in latter years, has lost some of the shine and glitter with which it was associated in the late 1950's.

I urge them, when looking back over last season, to place more emphasis on the balance sheet and the financial side of the club than on the playing record.

Despite a first-round Challenge Cup flop at Swinton, the team performed soundly on many occasions and generally showed signs that there is the nucleus of a team which could get among the honours with one or two judicious buys.

But the harsh, cold facts of cash and specator appeal leave a lot to be desired.

The net loss of £5000-plus, following another deficit the previous year, and a slump in income from the pools of almost 50 per cent., point to only one end — DISASTER.

Pools and gate receipts must be stepped up if the club is to turn the corner. No one can dispute that.

But how should it be done? This is the question which invariably brings out two points of view.

On the one hand there is the belief that the fans and members should show more interest in the club and increase income to provide cash with which to go into the transfer-market.

On the other is the argument that the club should provide a successful and attractive side — even if it means going further into debt — and win the fans' support in this way.

Of the two the latter is by far the more logical argument.

The committee has to put the goods in the shop window if they are to attract custom — custom which is crying out for a successful football team more than anything else.

The new social club may do well financially. I hope it does. So does everyone with the club at heart.

BUT THE TOP PRIORITY MUST BE A SUCCESSFUL TEAM WINNING ITS GAMES WITH A FAST, FLUENT BRAND OF FOOTBALL.

This, in turn, would not only increase the crowds; it would generally stimulate interest in the club from which would rise more income from the pools and other money-making efforts.

It would, too, play a big part in helping the social club to be successful.

Success breeds success. But it must begin on the field.

Last season's activities in the transfer-market must be a warning that misguided buys are worse than no buys at all.

At the last annual meeting, President Stanley Stretch pointed out that no expense had been spared in building up a sound team.

Certainly, the President had a point. Over £6,000 was spent on players. But, alas, the committee blundered in paying out precious cash on players who failed to achieve the desired object.

Two points must be considered by the new committee this winter. Firstly, the need for one or two judicious purchases. Secondly, the absolute necessity for getting the right men.

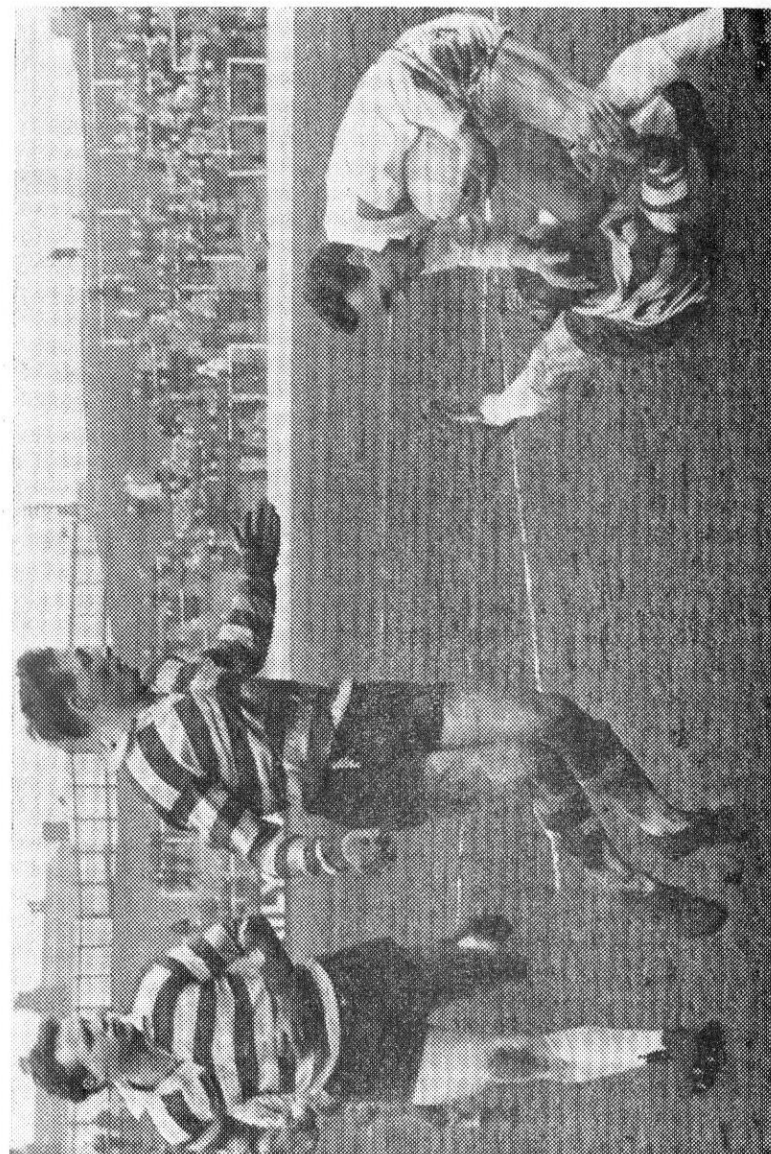

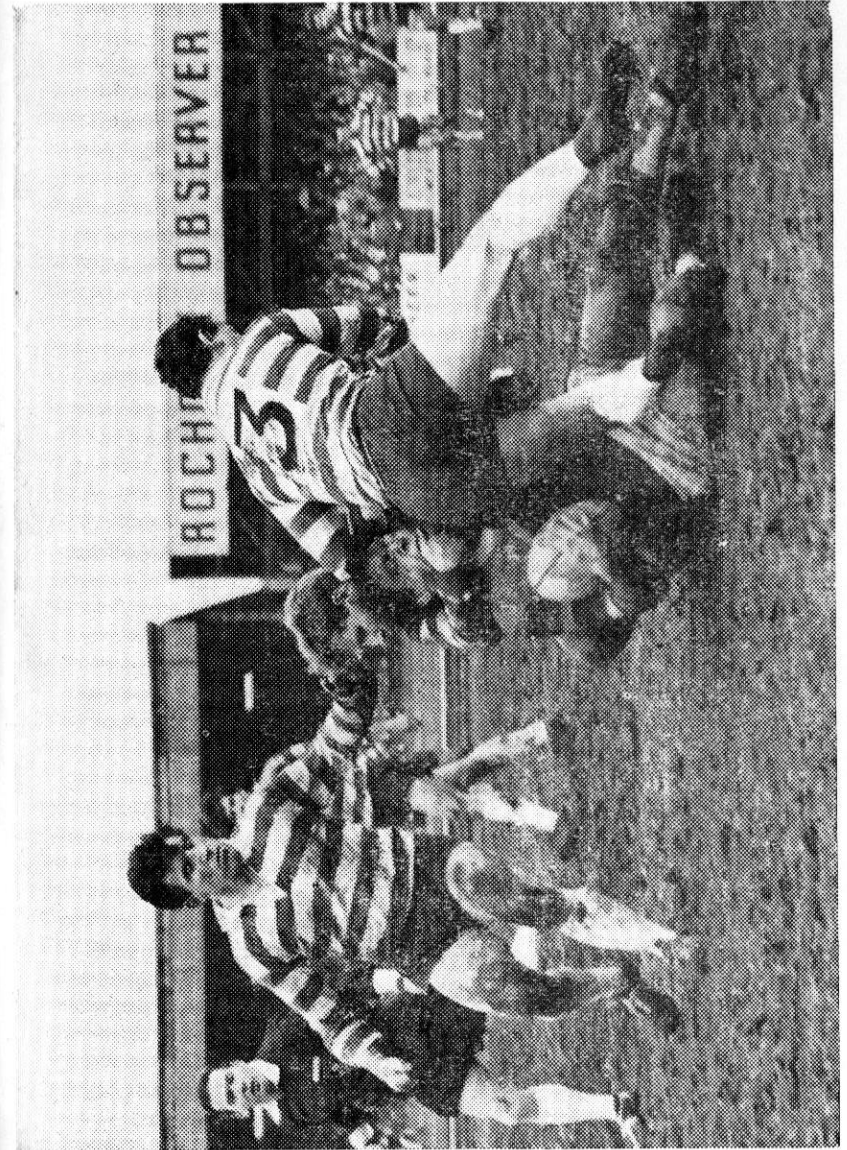

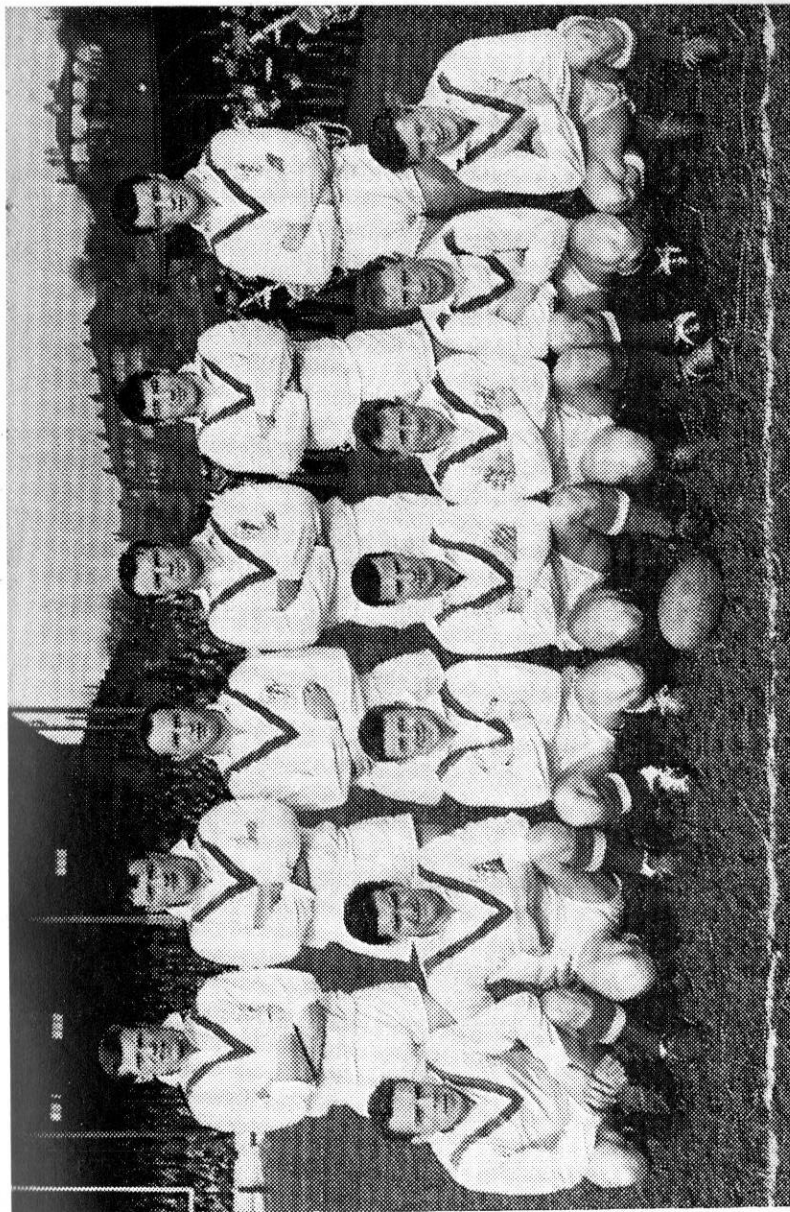
