


HERE AND THERE

Our attempts to bring Geoff Shelton to Watersheddings have failed despite our £5,000 offer.

ALAN BURNS

At 5.30 p.m. on Thursday evening January 12th Alan Burns rejoined his former club Whitehaven and began a series of brickbats aimed at the Oldham Committee. A Barrow newspaper stated that Barrow 'had been taken for a ride.' An Oldham newspaper read:— "Clearly Oldham have again lost out on a deal and further shown why they are regarded as a 'soft touch.' The whole affair has been handled badly."

A story is best started from the beginning and that's where I intend to start. At the end of last season Alan Burns was written to and was given a deadline date-July 1st-in which to make up his mind on whether it was his intention to return to Oldham or not. When the reply was to the negative Burns was placed on the transfer list at what was thought a very realistic fee £3,000. Barrow and Workington first made enquiries about this player and later were joined by Whitehaven. Leeds and Leigh. The Oldham Committee stated to all these clubs that £2,000 was the lowest figure they could accept for this player.

Burns told me that he would play for no one except Whitehaven. We once agreed for Burn's transfer to Leigh for £2,000. Leigh even promised him a taxi down to every match so that he could train and in fact live in Whitehaven-Burns turned it down. Workington also interviewed the player with a view to signing him but he would not join them. Leeds interviewed Burns. They offered him a month's trial but Burns turned this down despite the fact that the Headingley club were prepared to pay all his expenses for that month's accommodation in the city.

The matter was then left on the Watersheddings table for a few weeks and it was not until a further Whitehaven offer was made that the matter was brought to

the forefront again. Whitehaven offered a figure of £500 and they stated 'that's the highest we can go.' In view of this we contacted Barrow and asked them to consider an exchange deal, Delooze for Burns. They thought about it and eventually agreed. I felt in my own mind that Burns would turn down a move to the Furness Club and my thoughts received foundation when Burns failed to keep an engagement with the Barrow Club.

Whitehaven in view of the negotiations going on between Barrow and ourselves contacted us again and, because of a generous donation from their supporters organisation decided they could now offer £1,000 for Burns and this was accepted. Surely it is better to cut one's losses.

The whole point in enquiring about Delooze was not 'a sprat to catch a mackerel' as has been said but a sensible way in which to get a forward playing for you in preference to a forward not playing for you.

To say that "the affair has been handled badly" and that we "have taken

Barrow for a ride" is just ridiculous.

Final note: Just over two years ago Tommy Warburton and Bob Irving signed for Oldham, and didn't cost £1,000 between them.

CASTLEFORD SCORE BIG MACKESON WIN MASSIVE LEAD IN CONTEST TABLE

Castleford have scored a resounding win in Period 3 of the current Mackeson Rugby League Contest. Alan Hardisty's men have won the flag and silver tankards with the highest average of the season, the highest Period 3 average ever, and the biggest-ever margin over their rivals.

The Flood-lit TV Champions scored an average of 27.67 points in winning all their six matches in the Period. Next best, in a continued spell of Yorkshire domination, were Wakefield Trinity (18.25), Hull K.R. (16.63) and Leeds (15.50).

Castleford's Mackeson success is their second since the contest began five seasons ago-their previous win was in Period 4 of the 1963/4 campaign.

Castleford's prizes will be presented before the start of their important televised home match with Leeds on Saturday, February 11.
