

At full-back is local boy Frank Barrow, who is a sound defensive player and also a very good link-man. The St. Helens threequarters are a very dangerous foursome, with Tom Vollenhoven on one flank and ace goalkicker Len Killeen on the other. The 'Saints' have now no further interest in the Cup (they were surprisingly beaten by Salford in a fantastic replay) so they can now put all they have in their efforts to stay near to the top in the League race. However, we hope that after this evening's encounter they will not have improved their League position.




