

WELCOME, HALIFAX

A hearty welcome is extended this evening to officials, players and supporters from Thrum Hall. Halifax have recently returned to form with 5 successive victories to their credit following 12 consecutive defeats. They bring with them a former Oldham player, Jack Pycroft, who they recently purchased from Batley for a substantial fee, but it is a somewhat unfamiliar-looking Halifax side which is to face us in this evening's encounter, with the faces of Terry Fogerty, Ken Roberts and Alan Kellett all missing from their team, having been transferred to other clubs.

At full-back will be ginger-haired Barry Cooper who has proved a good replacement for Ron James and who kicks goals in the style of the great Billy Horne. The flying Johnny Freeman and former Doncaster player Peter Goodchild, will no doubt wear the No. 2 and No. 5 jerseys outside centres Jones and very powerful Colin Dixon who has returned to the centre position after a spell in the forwards. Barry Robinson and Pycroft were in brilliant form in last week's defeat of Castleford at Thrum Hall, and if they reproduce the same dash and sparkle in this evening's game then Canning and Warburton will both have their work cut out containing their opposite numbers.

In the pack the Halifax club are well blessed despite the loss of the forwards already referred to. Scroby, Foye and Kelley make up the Halifax front row, and in the second row Halifax have Terry Ramshaw and Ray Fearnley. Ramshaw is considered by many to be the best second-rower in the country and after seeing his performance against Castleford last week a lot is to be said for this view.
