RULES OF THE TOURNAMENT

Games will be played under the Laws of the Rugby Football League.

Each side will consist of seven players, the usual formation being three forwards and four backs.

Selection may be made from eight players but once a game has started substitution will only be allowed up to commencement of the second half.

The duration of each game, before the final game, will be sixteen minutes, i.e., seven and a half minutes each way with one minute interval at half time. If at the end of sixteen minutes the game is drawn, the teams shall change over and continue playing until one side scores, such side being the winner, ends being changed every seven and a half minutes if necessary. In extra time there will be no interval. The final tie will be played for ten minutes each way, with an interval of one minute at half time.

Time is checked by an independent Time Keeper who allows for injury time. A klaxon indicates the end of each session of play, except that if a try has been scored the scoring side shall be allowed to attempt the conversion.


