

WELCOME TO LIVERPOOL

A very hearty welcome is extended to officials, players and supporters of the

Liverpool City club for this first league game of the season.

Liverpool are always attractive opposition and always play open football despite the fact that they may be well behind. They are a club with plenty of enthusiasm and their Board must be congratulated on the way in which they handle the affairs of the Club. A sample of this is in the shape of Jim Challinor, who will probably be in the Liverpool side this evening. The Club have done well in securing the services of Jim who should prove to be a very valuable asset to the Merseysiders.

LAWS OF THE GAME

Many people will know that certain Laws have been amended during the close season and these will be operative this season. One important amendment is

that concerning the Penalty Kick.

This season the player taking a penalty kick is not obliged to kick it ten yards or even to pass the mark. He can take the penalty in exactly the same way as the second kick was taken under the Law which applied in the 1966-67 season. This amendment is made necessary because under the 1966-67 rule a player near the opponents goal line often kicked to touch and then had to bring the ball back to almost the same position to recommence play with a tap kick. It is better to allow him to take the tap in the first place. If the kicker does kick a penalty into touch, then he can re-start play with a second kick or tap as was done under the 1966-67 Law.

Another amendment will be included in the Leigh match programme on Saturday.
