

#### OFFICIAL NEWS AND VIEWS.

The build-up in playing strength at Borough Park continues slowly but surely. The Directors were delighted on Bank Holiday Monday to secure, at last, the signature of Tony Colloby, the Workington and Cumberland County centre or wing, and he did sufficiently well in his first game after a long layoff to show us that he will be an asset to the Club for another few seasons. A Cumberland selector present at the game against Huyton was sufficiently impressed to recommend his selection for the County against Yorkshire at Whitehaven on Wednesday next.

These notes are written before our Cup Tie against Leigh, but having seen Leigh nearly topple Wigan at Central Park we have no doubt had a double handful to deal with at Hilton Park. Whatever the result at Leigh we must draw encouragement from the fact that we already have two wins under our belt and nearly another against a strong Swinton side. The last two home matches did indeed provide a varied bill. Unfortunately our lads took the field against Swinton with a different line-up to the one planned because of the late arrival of Ray Ashby who appeared at the ground at 3-15 p.m. for a 3-00 kick-off. This was Ray's first experience of travelling to Blackpool in Bank Holiday traffic and he will know better next time. Nevertheless, Swinton were fully extended to beat us and at one point, when we were leading 12 points to 4, it really did look like our first win at Borough Park over them

On Monday against Huyton, apart from Tony Colloby and Ray Ashby having their first games for the Club, a trialist from Salford, Allan Gregory, was given a run on the wing. His normal position is centre and we hope to see him in this position before long. He has certainly got the physique for the job.
