CLUB NOTES

WELL though the team has played since the opening of the season, our boys excelled themselves last week against Huyton. The fact that Huyton had previously held teams like St. Helens, Widnes and Warrington to narrow margins, only serves to underline the authority of the football we displayed, particularly in the first half. It was great to see Jimmy Thompson at last obtaining some reward for many sterling displays when he sparked off an avalanche of scoring with that first try, which was in itself a classic piece of distributive and supporting play. Cotton ran powerfully through the middle to carve out the opening for Williams to cross. Smith added a try of the type we have come to expect from him, followed by a typical Morgan burst to the line. Just on half-time, Cotton filled Huyton's cup to the brim with another excellent try. Four goals by Kellett brought the half-time score to 23-0.

If the Rovers felt they had done enough to win, there was no evidence of it in the third quarter of the game. Morgan quickly opened the gap once more and then powerfully drove for the line, making light of the full-back's challenge. Rhodes, again having a splendid game, scored a fine solo try; and Dave Kellett initiated and rounded-off a delightful bout of passing to score our final try. Three more goals by Cyril Kellett gave us our highest points-total of the season. Huyton never gave up, and gained a converted consolation try near the end. That we were not given full credit for our performance by the week-end press is something that often happens, but, be that as it may, I personally feel that most teams would have been outclassed by our effort last Saturday.

LAST Sunday the Post Office Road Ground was loaned to the Castleford & District Amateur Rugby League Association for the purpose of playing their annual seven-a-side competition for the Gordon Noon Trophy. At this competition, Mr. J. Jepson, the Featherstone Chairman, presented, on behalf of the Association, a plaque to Colin Smith, to mark his appearance in last year's amateur international team.



OUR VISITORS

MAKING one of their rare appearances at Post Office Road are our nevertheless very welcome visitors from Oldham. One hopes that today's game will be contested in the same spirit as that exciting away match earlier in the season, and if so we are in for a very entertaining afternoon's sport. The two points which finally decided that high-scoring match emphasised how evenly matched the two teams were; and in order to gain our first double of the season, home supporters will fervently hope that our boys can reproduce last week's form and so strengthen our position in the league table. Certainly, Oldham will be a much tougher nut to crack than Huyton, for they play with the tremendous sort of team-spirit and determination which has carried our own team thus far. However, Red Rose opposition invariably brings out the best in our team, so another fine game is in prospect.

It is five-and-a-half years since Oldham last appeared at Post Office Road — 15th May 1963, to be exact — when a crowd of 3,065 (£214) saw our boys win an excellent game by 30 points to 8 points.

Tries were scored for Rovers by Lynch, Cooper, Waterworth, Dixon, Ramshaw and Broom. Jack Anderson kicked six goals.

Rovers team on that occasion was:
Anderson; Waterworth, Broom, Lynch, Jordan; Cooper, Dooler; Dixon, Fawley, Tonks, Ramshaw, Clawson and Clifft.

In the return fixture, Oldham gained their revenge by 26 points to 2 points. The interesting feature of that match was that it heralded the resumption of sport after almost the whole of Britain had been held in a grip of ice and snow from 15th December 1963 to 9th March 1964.


