

CUP DAY

Today sees the second round of the Rugby League Challenge Cup competition under way and we are proud to have one of the league's most attractive teams, St. Helens, here at Watersheddings.

St. Helens are having a very good season and are up there amongst the leaders at the present moment having lost only two of 23 League games. They have scored 381 points for and have conceded 163 points. We always seem to rise to the occasion when playing St. Helens and have turned in some good performances in the past, we hope that today's game will be no exception.

In our team we have several St. Helens based players and they particularly will be all out to impress.

The game at Leigh two weeks ago was a fiasco. Abandoned after 23 mins. play by referee Graham Scholefield of Salford, spectators swarmed across the field demanding their money back, an exact repeat of the happenings at Oldham on Saturday 14th December, when the two teams were due to meet.

In my opinion the referee made his decision to abandon the game too quickly. He was right in bringing the players off in a terrible rain storm, but soon afterwards, although being a far from pleasant afternoon, the conditions were good enough for the game to

continue. This is a spectators game and they should be given first priority all the time. If these kind of things continue to happen then it is no wonder that spectators stay at home and watch football and racing on television. Mr. Scholefield made his decision after a four minutes wait, if he had waited just a couple of minutes longer, as he was requested to do by the officials of both Clubs, the situation would have resolved itself and everyone would have been happy including the players.

WELCOME - ST. HELENS

It is indeed a pleasure to entertain this afternoon, our very good friends from Knowsley Road, St. Helens. As has been said earlier, the 'Saints' are at present on the crest of a wave and will certainly need some stopping in this afternoon's Cup-tie.

They have a formidable side from No. I straight through to loose forward and only a top form display by Oldham will be good enough to get them through to Round 3.

Austin Rhodes and Ken Williams have been filling the full back berth well in the absence of Frank Barrow. It is nice to have players of the calibre of Rhodes and Williams on your register who can fill any vacancy in the backs with equal ability. Frank Barrow is recovering from a serious leg injury.


