Firstly Benyon saw his 'up and under' kick hit the upright and bounce favourably for him and then secondly we were unfortunate in seeing Derek Whitehead badly dazed in an effort to stop the St. Helens centre from scoring. As it turned out, the Whitehead injury proved to be vital, for one feels he would have easily 'popped over' a couple of goals from penalties handed out a few minutes later, following St. Helens offences.

It was a match in which we could have no complaints at all, however, for for St. Helens took their chances well and they had to overcome a first half hammering in the scrums and also had to reorganise their set-up when winger Les Jones was ordered off early in the second half.

As a matter of fact I consider that Jones was perhaps unfortunate to be sent off. Don't misunderstand me, I think his action deserved the fate it got, but this doesn't alter the fact that any one of four team mates could have joined him for that proverbial 'early bath'. It would appear that Jones was a victim of circumstances but I do understand that York referee, John Hebblethwaite had to punish someone but it appears a shame for Jones to suffer with an isolated incident when other players got away with equally dirty actions time and time again.

St. Helens are at Warrington today in the third stage of their Cup campaign. Personally I can't for one minute see the boys from Wilderspool, as enterprising as they might be, stopping these big boys from Knowsley Road.

Firstly, they had a set-back as early as the fifth minute when key man, hooker Malcolm Moss, had to retire with a leg injury and from this point Workington never really recovered. Hooker Moss will be unavailable this afternoon following his injury at Salford, but Allen I am sure will prove an able deputy. His props today will be Les Moore (another former Whitehaven player) and Dennis Martin.

Harold McCourt, brother of Charlie, will pack down in the second row alongside McFarlane, and Calvin will be at loose forward in place of Bill Pattinson who injured an arm at Salford.

It is hoped that we return to winning form this afternoon to keep alive our top 16 play-off hopes although Workington will be out to do likewise.
