Welcome back to Tom Canning, who played in the "A" team Shield game against Warrington "A" last Saturday. Tom has now managed to overcome the problems connected with his new job, and we hope to see much more of this valuable player at Watersheddings from now on.

TODAY'S VISITORS

We extend a hearty welcome today to our friends from Cumberland. Last season we met Workington Town three times, losing 29—10 in the league game at Derwent Park, winning the Lancashire Cup 2nd Round match at Watersheddings 7—5, and winning the return league engagement at Watersheddings by 13 pts to 11.

This season, of course, we were beaten at Workington by 28 pts. to 7 pts., and we hope that this score will be reversed today.

Workington Town was formed in 1945 and joined the Northern Rugby Football League in season 1945/46.

They played their first game against Broughton Rangers (later Belle Vue) and won 27-5.

J. W. Mason and Dan Richardson, along with George Plumer, worked to form the new club. Tom Mitchell joined the board in the early days, and has been the mainstay behind the club ever since.

Although the club has never won the Lancashire League or Lancashire Cup, it has won the Rugby League Challenge Cup, in 1951/52, and was runner-up on two occasions. In 1950/51, Workington won the Northern Rugby League Championship, and has been runner-up once.

Famous players include Gus Risman, who managed the club, Norman Herbert, Bill Ivison, the present coach, Ike Southward, Brian Edgar, Ray Glastonbury and Paul Charlton, to mention just a handful of their many stars, past and present.


