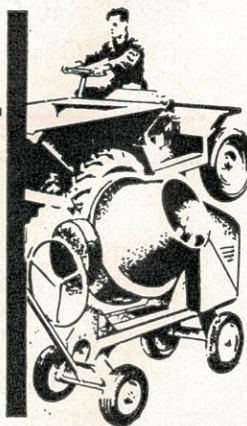

CLUB NEWS

Since the last programme notes, we have played only one first team game, at Barrow on Friday, October 24th, which we lost by 19 points to 26 points. The team played much better football than they have done in previous games, and with a little more steadiness and accuracy in finishing, could very probably have won this match. We are hoping for better things this afternoon.

Although we seem to be getting over the worst of the crop of injuries suffered by our players in the early part of the season, the injury to our Captain, Ken Wilson, in the Keighley match, and that sustained by Charlie McCourt at Barrow, are further set-backs to our getting a settled team. Ken is hoping to be fit very soon, but Charlie looks like being out of action for at least another two weeks.

DAVID KNOX

It is felt that the report in the local press regarding our discussions with David Knox, the Australian second-row forward from the Manly-Warringah Club, could bear some elaboration. This player came to Watersheddings for talks, at which it was disclosed that he had not obtained clearance from Australia to play in this country. This could have taken up to a month to obtain, and would therefore have reduced Knox's availability to something like two months, as he is due to return home early in February. We had not seen Knox play, but had merely been informed by Warrington that he was available. He was asked to train with our own lads, and play trials before talking definite terms, but was reluctant to do this. In view of the fact that we are hopeful of signing Alan Maddalena, the Newtown centre-three-quarter in the near future, the Club felt that we were better advised, in the circumstances, to concentrate on Maddalena, rather than on Knox, a comparatively unknown player.

TODAY'S VISITORS

We extend a sincere and warm welcome today to the Whitehaven Club, who began the season in fine style and were in fact at the top of the League for a time. More recently, however, they have not been so fortunate. We hope that today's game will be a good one, played in the true spirit of Rugby League Football.

Whitehaven were formed in season 1948-49, and elected to the Northern Rugby Football League by 14 votes to 11. The first game, at home against Hull, was won 5-0. The team that day included such players as Stanley Brogden, Trevor Petcher, Jack Kitching and Tom Cornelius, with a sprinkling of other experienced players and local stars of the amateur game.

The only honour won by the Club was in 1955-56, when the "A" team won the Lancashire Combination Shield.

Ted Hodgson (Oldham, Broughton Rangers and Cumberland County player) was one of the early signings, and he did a spell of coaching with the Cumbrians.

Tom Mageen was associated with the birth of both Workington Town and Whitehaven, and he was a great all-round sportsman, having interests in greyhound racing, hound trailing and motor cycle racing. He was also a famous owner of Lakeland terriers.

Well-known players with the Whitehaven Club have included Dick Huddart, the Fearon brothers, Neville Emery, Syd Lowden, Geoff Robinson, the McCourt brothers, Alec Cassie, Colloby, Burns, Holliday and Shillinglaw.

During the last four seasons Whitehaven have fared rather badly in the Northern League placings at the end of the seasons, as follows:

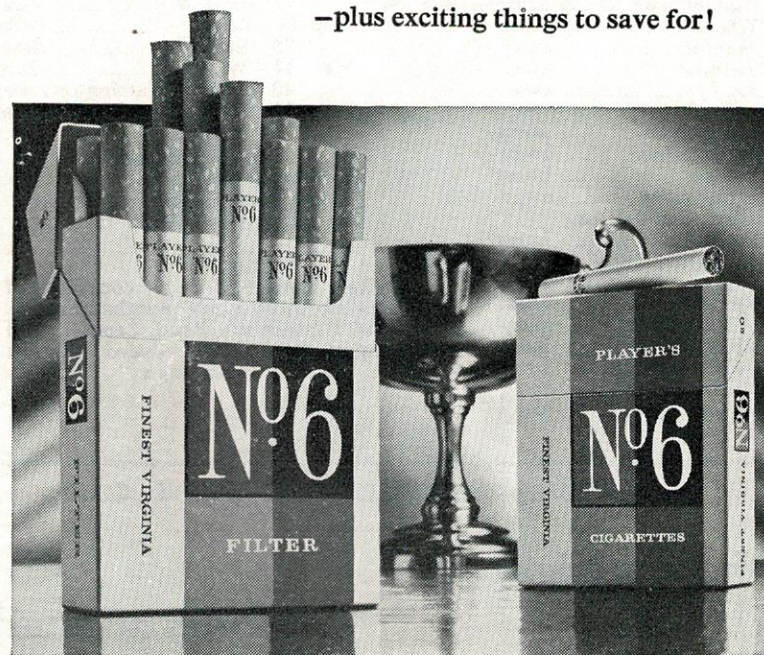
