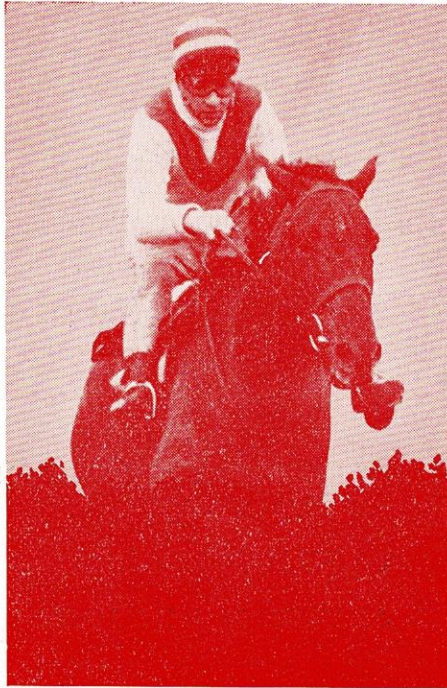

A RUGBY MIRACLE

Chairman of Bradford Northern Harry Womersley goes into print this week in a dynamic fashion. He suggests that five top legislators be appointed to be in office for a minimum period of three years to make rule changes and any other major revisions they feel would benefit the game of Rugby League Football he says:

"The trouble with some clubs is that they make no effort. They rely on the stronger clubs to subsidise them. I would like to see a first division of 12 clubs, the other 18 forming a Second Division with three up and three down."

On the four tackle rule Mr. Womersley says, "We strongly support St Helens campaigners for its abolition, the best Rugby I have ever seen was in the mid-fifties and I would like to see a return to the rules which operated then, under the four tackles most of the football is artificial and there is far too much panic handling and kicking, and why, he says not a yearly tournament between the top sides in Britain, Australia, New Zealand and France? Our trouble is that we do not think big enough.

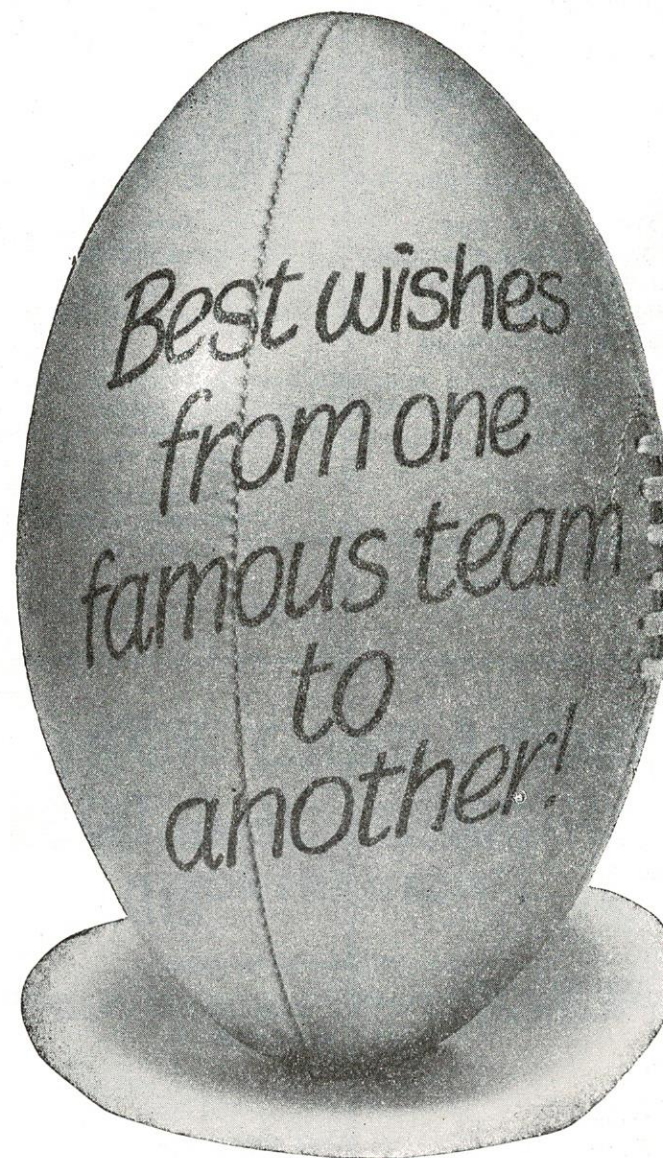
