RECENT TEAM PERFORMANCES

Supporters will recollect that the last home game was a month ago, when, as an experiment, we played a Sunday match on November 16th against Widnes. Though the weather was against us on the day, nevertheless this fixture attracted an attendance of 2,093, which was only slightly below the average for all Rugby League games played the previous day (Saturday, November 15th). This gives us some encouragement re-Sunday football, and it is our intention to try out this idea again some time in the New Year.

The Widnes match was lost by a mere two points, i.e. a goal kick, and we were justifiably proud of the way our team of triers stuck to their task against a driving wind and snowstorm throughout the game.

At St. Helens on November 22nd, we were heavily defeated by 41 points to ten points; we offer no excuses for this — we were well beaten by a faster, heftier and more experienced team.

However, this was one match we must try to forget; with two divisions looming up next season, every effort must be made to strike the winning trail, and the writer knows that our players are fully aware of this situation.

TODAY'S VISITORS

We are always more than pleased to welcome our good friends from Wigan — it seems a long time since we beat them thirteen times in succession, but many older supporters will remember that this was accomplished some years ago! Fortunes have changed, of course, since then. Nowadays it appears that Wigan usually have it their own way when playing Oldham, but, bearing in mind the closeness of the final result in our Floodlit Second Round match at Central Park on November 11th (14-4) we are confident of giving them a good game today! Also the fact that the T.V. cameras are here will no doubt put players of both teams on their mettle.

INJURIES

Ken Wilson is now fit again and we are delighted to see this grand player back in action.

Charlie McCourt, unfortunately, is definitely out for the rest of the season due to the very serious neck injury sustained in the Barrow game on October 24th. Having been into hospital twice in recent weeks, Charlie has now been ordered to wear his cervical collar at all times for the next six weeks, before reporting for a further examination at Oldham and District General Hospital.

This "gradely lad" still remains cheerful in the face of this tremendous handicap, and we wish him the best of everything, and, perhaps by some miracle, a speedy recovery. Charlie will, I'm sure, be present at today's game as a spectator!

HALF-TIME JUNIOR SCHOOLS SEVENS' COMPETITION

This should have been inaugurated last Saturday at the Huddersfield match, which due to severe freezing on the pitch and terracing, had to be postponed.

Therefore, today, as we are a week behind with these schoolboy games, supporters will be able to see St. Patrick's v. Parish Church as a curtain-raiser before the senior match, and Hathershaw v. St. Mary's at half-time.

Play is four minutes each way, dispensing with goal kicks, and if the score is a draw, the winners will be decided by the toss of a coin.

This competition will continue as an added attraction at half-time at the rest of our home first team matches till the end of the season. We are indebted to the officials of the Oldham Schools' Junior Rugby League for their very prompt response when this competition idea was put to them towards the end of November, and are sure that the sporting public of Oldham will give their ready encouragement to these youngsters at the conclusion of each game.

Mr. George Dew, the local civil engineering contractor, has very generously donated a trophy for the eventual winners of the Half-time Junior Sevens Competition. The final is expected to take place on 11th April, 1970, at our game v. Batley.

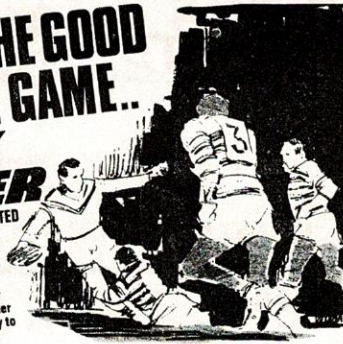

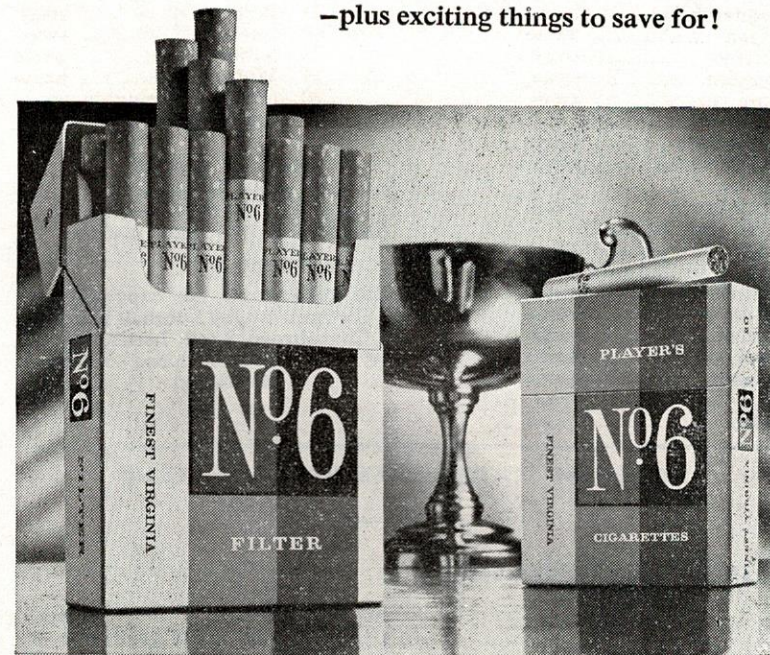
