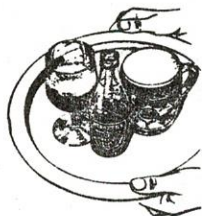

OFFICIAL NOTES

Following last week's game at Oldham we soon renew acquaintance with our friends from Watersheddings, for they are visitors to Fartown this afternoon.

Last Saturday we were successful by 14 points to 6. Naturally we hope to complete the "double" to-day and thus continue the improvement in our League fortunes.

Oldham have been going through a lean spell recently and have had a run of seven defeats. We must expect no easy passage though, for they have often surprised us at Fartown in the past.

Many of their players are well known to us, although there are one or two new names. Still prominent in the second row for them is Bob Irving, who is a product of Huddersfield Amateur Rugby League football. Irving has, of course, won Test honours.

Another player with representative honours is Kevin Taylor, who started in Oldham Schools R.L. A couple of seasons ago Taylor had the unusual distinction for a hooker of being Oldham's joint leading try-scorer along with Mike Elliott.

It is just twelve months since Oldham signed Jim Crellin from Workington, and when goal-kicker Derek Whitehead was transferred to Warrington last October Crellin took the goal-kicking job at Watersheddings.

Easily their leading try-scorer with 17 is Wilf Briggs, who has just returned after being in dispute with the club. Irving follows him with 11, while Elliott and Crellin have six each.

Phil Larder and Ken Wilson were signed from Rugby Union clubs, the latter being an England International under the amateur code. Loose forward Ray Clark previously played for Warrington, while that lively

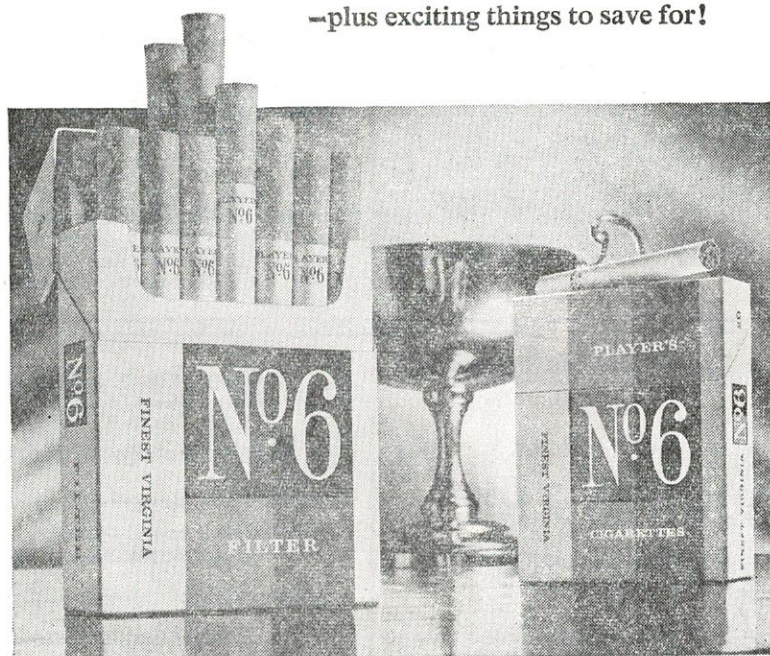

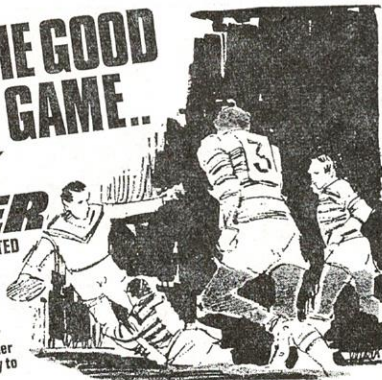
