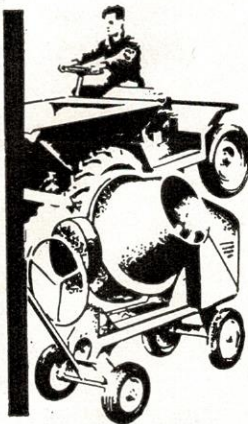

### TODAY'S VISITORS

We are very pleased today to be entertaining Barrow, who have recently achieved some fame as the big-spenders of Rugby League, with the signings of Jarrett, Foster and MacFarlane. Keith Jarret will not, of course, be with us today as he is on International duty in France, but no doubt the other two players will be in Barrow's team.

Memories of our visit to Barrow on 24th October give rise to mixed feelings, because of the serious injury sustained in that match by our second-row forward, Charlie McCourt. However, Charlie, always smiling, is making good progress and will doubtless be watching today's game. I am sure I speak for many members and supporters when I say how much this grand player has been missed on the field of play in recent weeks. Our best wishes to Charlie for a complete recovery in the not too distant future.

### WATERSHEDDINGS COMMENTARY

Recent team performances have left much to be desired — having lost 23—15 to Wigan on December 13th, 28—2 to Swinton on Boxing Day, 1969, and conceded defeat to Huddersfield in both home and away games, the outlook seems far from bright.

However, there was certainly a much more determined effort put in at Huddersfield last Saturday, but our main problem once again was lack of finishing power. Our lads must learn to steady up on attack. When a team is down, as we have been for some weeks, it is very easy to make mistakes by trying too hard. Ken Wilson and Dennis Wright have taken over training on a temporary basis and we must give these two chaps a fair chance to do something with the side. The resignation of Gerry Helme as Coach, whilst reluctantly accepted by the Committee, was exaggerated out of all proportion in the local press. Gerry felt sincerely and honestly that he was not getting the right response from the team, and so tendered his resignation. Despite press reports, he did not withdraw his resignation, but merely came up to the Club on the Tuesday after the Huddersfield home match to say his last goodbyes. The recent news of Gerry's further illness is very sad, and we all wish him the very best and a quick return to good health.

With regard to the team itself. The recent introduction to senior football of centre-threequarters Terry Garrett and second-row man Steve Baldwin is already proving a qualified success. Their lack of experience can only be improved upon by more first team outings, and I am confident we shall be seeing much more of these two players in the future.

Furthermore, now that we have a full complement of players once again, and a very short injury list, we stand a good chance of getting a settled cup squad in time for the First Round Challenge Cup Tie v. Blackpool Borough. Seat tickets will be on sale to member seat holders from Wednesday evening, 28th January, until Saturday, 31st January. As supporters are no doubt aware, one-third of the seating accommodation has to be offered to the visiting club. Seat tickets will then be on sale to the general public during the week commencing 2nd February.

### THE YOUNGER GENERATION

Two players who have recently secured promotion from the "B" team to our "A" team are David Dowd and Brian Reddyoff, both local lads. Also showing up very well in "B" team matches is Geoff. Munro, second-row or loose forward, who signed professional forms for the Club on 21st December. Derek Fletcher, younger brother of Ray Fletcher, will also become an Oldham professional in the near future.

Tony Eccles, the Failsworth boy, aged 15, who recently played for Lancashire Schoolboys, has now become a member of the Oldham "B" team, and has already played in several matches. Unfortunately, last Saturday in the cup-tie at Rochdale, Tony sustained an injury which will put him out of action for a short time — a broken collar-bone. Hard luck, Tony, but this lad will be back for more, we are sure!
