OUR VISITORS

In welcoming the Blackpool team to 'Shedding for today's cup-tie, we are conscious of the fact that they include the "one that got away" — Billy Boston — in the side! We are also pleased to know that former Oldham full-back Brian Bury has made a successful comeback to the game and is not only kicking goals for Borough, but scoring tries as well. These two players, together with Johnny Stopford, the former Swinton wing three-quarter, appear to be really enjoying their revived interest in our game. Keith Holden, another former Oldham player, is coaching Borough at present and he also will be on his mettle today.

Like ourselves, Blackpool are not well-off financially — one would think that a town the size of Blackpool would give more support to its Rugby League Club, but that is the trend nowadays at most clubs.

It is up to us within the game to take Rugby League by the scruff of the neck and really shake it up! The four-tackle rule, for instance, has certainly been found wanting. How many times this season have we seen a team hammering its opponent's line, but failing to score because it has run out of the permitted number of tackles? How often do we see a kicking duel between opposing full-backs, as in the days of Ganley and Ledgard?

Rugby League in recent years has become a forwards' game — one sometimes wonders when the wingers are going to be brought into the attack, if at all! Most of the leading try-scorers in the Player's No. 6 Championship Award Competition are half-backs, closely followed by forwards — this in itself is significant of current tactics.

Today's cup-tie will be a keen tussle, no doubt, with both teams trying to belie their lowly league positions in an effort to make further progress on the Wembley trail!

THE WATERSHEDDINGS SCENE

In our home game v Barrow on Saturday, January 24th, we lost by one solitary point, the final score of 13—12 reflecting our need of a consistent goal-kicker! The two tries, scored by Phil Larder and Ray Clark, were both good ones.

The signing last week of Colin Standing, Wigan's Welsh International forward, and of local lad Bill Churm from Salford, certainly stiffened up the pack for our visit to Whitehaven last Saturday. Here again, however, although leading by 9 points to 4 at the interval, we finally lost 11—9. This, although partly due to injuries to Garrett and Dunn, once again shows how a game can be won or lost by a solitary goal-kick! It was heartening, however, to see all three tries scored by our three-quarter line, the scorers being Joe Collins, Mike Elliott and Phil Larder. The two new recruits to our team showed up very well in this match, and Bob Irving had his best game for many weeks!

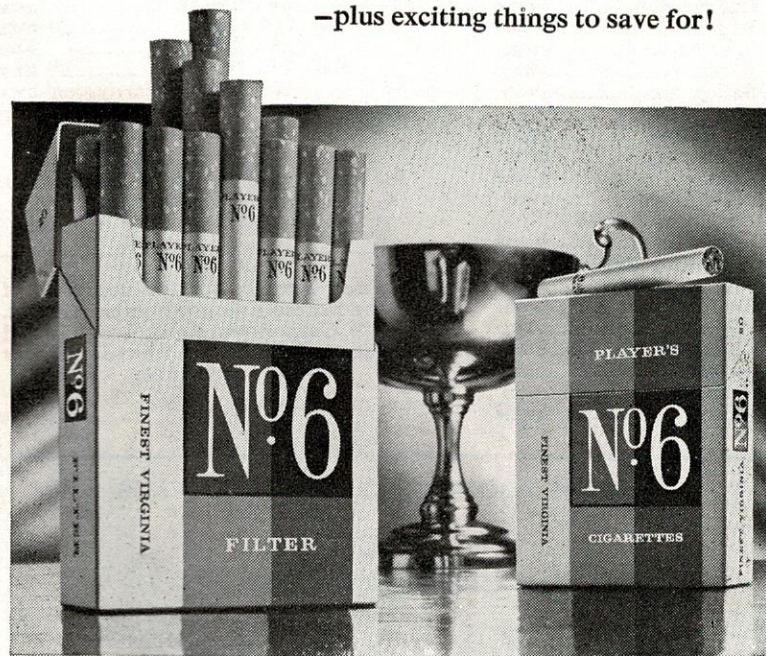
