COACH'S CORNER

In these notes I have decided to try and keep away from doing inquests of previous matches. It's not that I'm ducking the issue because we've lost our opening matches. It is because I believe that any comments I have are first and foremost for the players and should be said to them rather than stated publicly. Nobody knows better than a player when he has played badly. The thing to be done is to look for the reason and if possible find a way of improving the performance.

However I can comment about general team play. There are two main aspects of this when your team has the ball. There are the set pieces when the game is stopped and you have time for each player to go to a planned position and know exactly where he is going to run. These are the set moves from scrums and the tap after a penalty kick to touch. These we are not doing too badly.

The other aspect, and this is the major part of the game, is when there is only a semi stoppage as at the play the ball and the game is on the move more. There isn't time for everyone to get into an exact pre-planned position. For this part of the game a pattern of play has to be evolved—for both defence and attack. This is the important part of a team's play, for all the moves added together would only take up eight to ten minutes of a game. This part we are not doing too well.

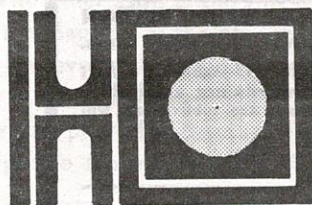
