Good morning and a warm Christmas welcome to you all. A special word of welcome to our friends from Oldham, to their Committee, players and supporters alike. We also wish to welcome their Chairman, Mr. Arthur Walker, and their Player-Coach Graham Starkey on their first official visit to the Athletic Grounds since leaving similar positions with our Club.

Today's Boxing Day fixture gives us the opportunity to wish everyone concerned a very happy Christmas and a Prosperous and Sporting New Year.

Following our match at Halifax last Saturday, Peter Birchall, who received a blow in the mouth which needed three stitches and the loss of two teeth, appears to be definitely out of the side today, in which case Coach Derrick Schofield intends to play a pack of Brown, Clarke, Delooze W., Earl, Hodgkinson and Delooze H. Another change appears certain in the back division. Terry Dolly, who has not been hitting the high spots of late, will almost certainly be replaced by a now fit Tommy Pimblett who passed a fitness test on Monday evening.

Oldham, who are enjoying a reasonably successful season and are just in the top half of the league table in the 14th position, do not anticipate any change from the side that did well against Barrow in their victory at Watersheddings last Saturday. At full back they have Martin Murphy who, like our own Joe Chamberlain, is having his best season, and recently played for Lancashire. On the wings are Phil Larder and Ray Clark, in whom we have had more than a passing interest. Our ex-Player-Coach Graham Starkey and Terry Garrett fill the centre positions. Among the forwards are Ken Wilson, who at one time was an amateur boxer who is reported to have beaten in his heyday Bob Forster who recently fought for the heavyweight championship, Kevin Taylor who will prove a test for Peter Clarke, in the hooking position, and Bob Irving, second row forward, who recently toured Australasia with the Great Britain team.
