A New Beginning . . . And All That

Nearly 12 months ago, a handful of Oldham supporters, having seen their once-famous side humbled at Keighley, got together over a few drinks in the humblest of under-the-stand bars at Lawkholme Lane and began to plot the part they might play in the restoration of Oldham F.C. and all it stands for.

It was between whitewashed walls, with pie and sandwiches washed down by bottled ale, that the now-famous ginger group began their campaign to take over control at Watersheddings.

The group had the humblest of beginnings. And I would never have believed that the handful of chaps present at that after-the-match get-together at Keighley could have stayed the course or, indeed, led such an efficient and powerful campaign to bring changes in the Watersheddings Committee room.

We all know now what a powerful organisation it developed into — and it was thanks to the tremendous amount of hard work, electioneering if you like, and the togetherness of the group's members, coupled with a single-minded purpose to ACT rather than merely MOAN which saw the group pull off such a grand slam at the May election.

For nearly 100 years now, Oldham F.C. has been a power in local sporting circles — but the old ginger group, now sitting pretty as the establishment, with one exception, is sure to be remembered for ever in the annals of the club's history.

At the election, the members showed they wanted a change.

They got one. And so the 1970 - 71 season sees a new beginning at Watersheddings with nine completely fresh Committeemen, a new Chairman, a new Coach, a new Pools Organiser, and the new ideas which come with them.

I gave to the ginger group's candidates all the help I could in their pre-election battle. Not because I held any personal grudge against the former regime but merely because I was convinced that the town of Oldham, no matter how the club members felt, was generally looking for a big change in the set-up and a completely new start.

Now, the new men are in office — and it is up to them to put the promises made in their election manifesto into fruition.

Bob Irving

In September, 1966, when Bobby Irving was beginning to make an impression in the Rugby League world, many people predicted a great future for this stocky second-row man. Indeed, he was even being regarded in some circles as a certainty for the 1970 Australian Tour. That he was eventually picked for the tour came as a great source of satisfaction and surprise to Oldham's supporters, who have been starved of something to cheer about for so long.

Since those early days, when Bob first came sensationally on to the Rugby League scene, both Irving and his club have had their fair share of difficulties. Sixteen-year-old Bob signed on for Oldham in January, 1965, and, after playing a few games towards the end of 1964 - 65 season, was regarded as a good prospect. But the following season Bob was unable to find a regular first-team place, as Stuart Whitehead took advantage of Alan Burn's brilliant ball distribution to score 15 tries. But for the beginning of 1966 - 67 season Whitehead was injured (he was transferred to Salford in September, 1966) and Irving took his chance of a first-team place sensationally. So well did Bob play in fact that he was picked to play for the Great Britain Under-24 team in France in November, 1966. A good display in this match earned him his first full "cap", against France at Perpignan, in January, 1967, at the age of 19. He played in the return match at Wigan in March, 1967, but 1967 - 68 was to be his peak season in international Rugby League. With three consecutive Test match appearances against the touring Australians Bob reached the zenith in international Rugby League; and his name thus goes in the record books alongside those of the all-time greats of our game.

However, during this season, with the Oldham club having a disastrous time, Irving put in a transfer request. He was placed on the transfer list at a club record £14,000, which was later reduced to £10,000, but still brought no buyers. Bob settled his differences with the club and for two seasons has been Oldham's most consistent forward, his reward being captaincy of the side and the attainment of a "lifetime's ambition" with a trip to Australia.

I am sure that Bob would be the first person to thank Mr. Jack Errock, Oldham's representative (1969 - 70) on both the Rugby League Council and the International Selection Committee, who did a tremendous amount to help Bob make this "trip of a lifetime".

In paying this tribute, let us hope that Bob still has many years of rugby ahead of him, with perhaps another tour in 1974!

Odds And Ends

During the season Oldham were "nilled" four times but only Blackpool Borough failed to score against Oldham, in the first round Challenge Cup-tie. Eleven times Oldham failed to score a try in a match but only two teams failed to cross Oldham's line — Blackpool Borough (see above) and Rochdale Hornets (League). The biggest win of the season was 41 - 10 against Keighley in September, while St. Helens inflicted the biggest defeat (43 - 0) at Watersheddings in April. Wigan (40 - 10) and St. Helens (41 - 10) also scored big wins, as well as Salford (30 - 3), Swinton (28 - 2), Workington Town (28 - 7) and Widnes (25 - 4). The eighty-four points conceded in the two matches against St. Helens are the highest by either team in these matches, while the forty-three points St. Helens scored at Watersheddings rank as Oldham's biggest-ever home defeat. Only fifteen times did Oldham reach double figures during the season, while on thirty occasions opponents scored ten points or more. Oldham did not do the double all season but conceded eleven doubles.

However, for the fourth successive season, Oldham reached the 2nd round of the Rugby League Cup and, for the first time since the competition began in 1965, Oldham got past the first round of the Floodlit Competition. A brave Lancashire Cup fight against Swinton (the eventual winners) and Bob Irving's selection for the Australian Tour are the only other points of note in a depressing season.

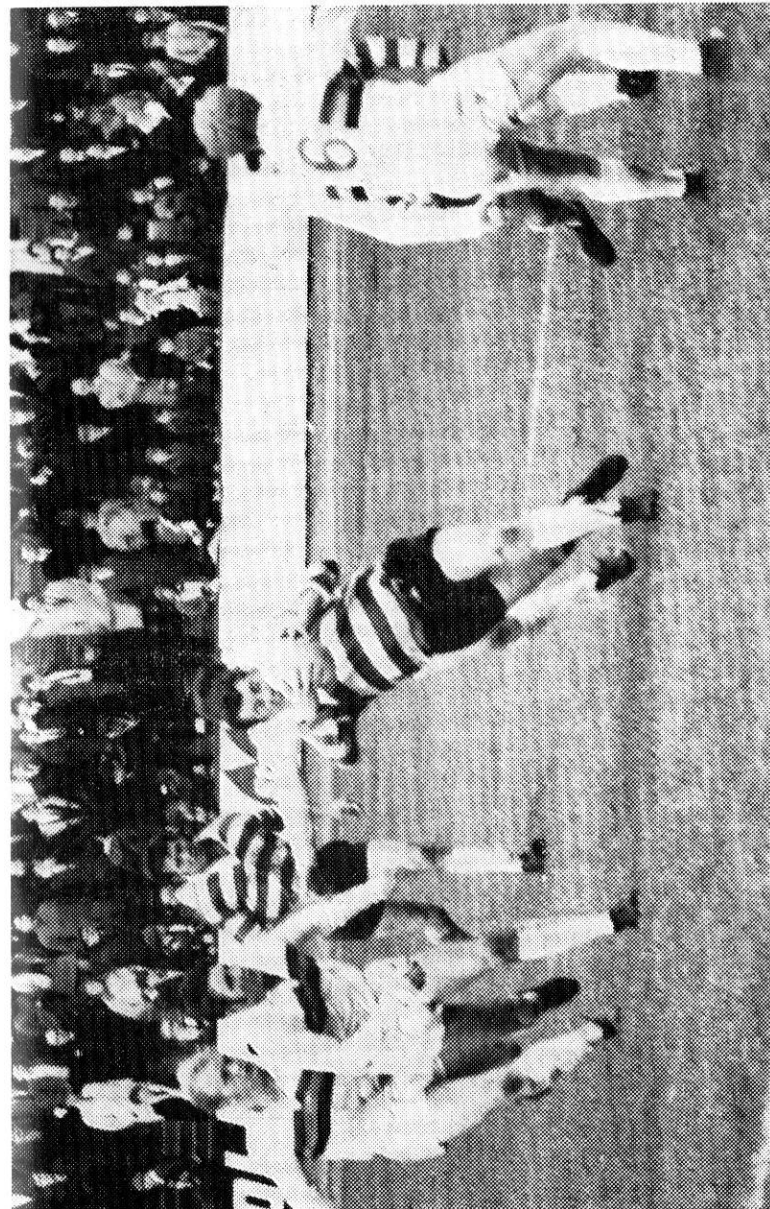
