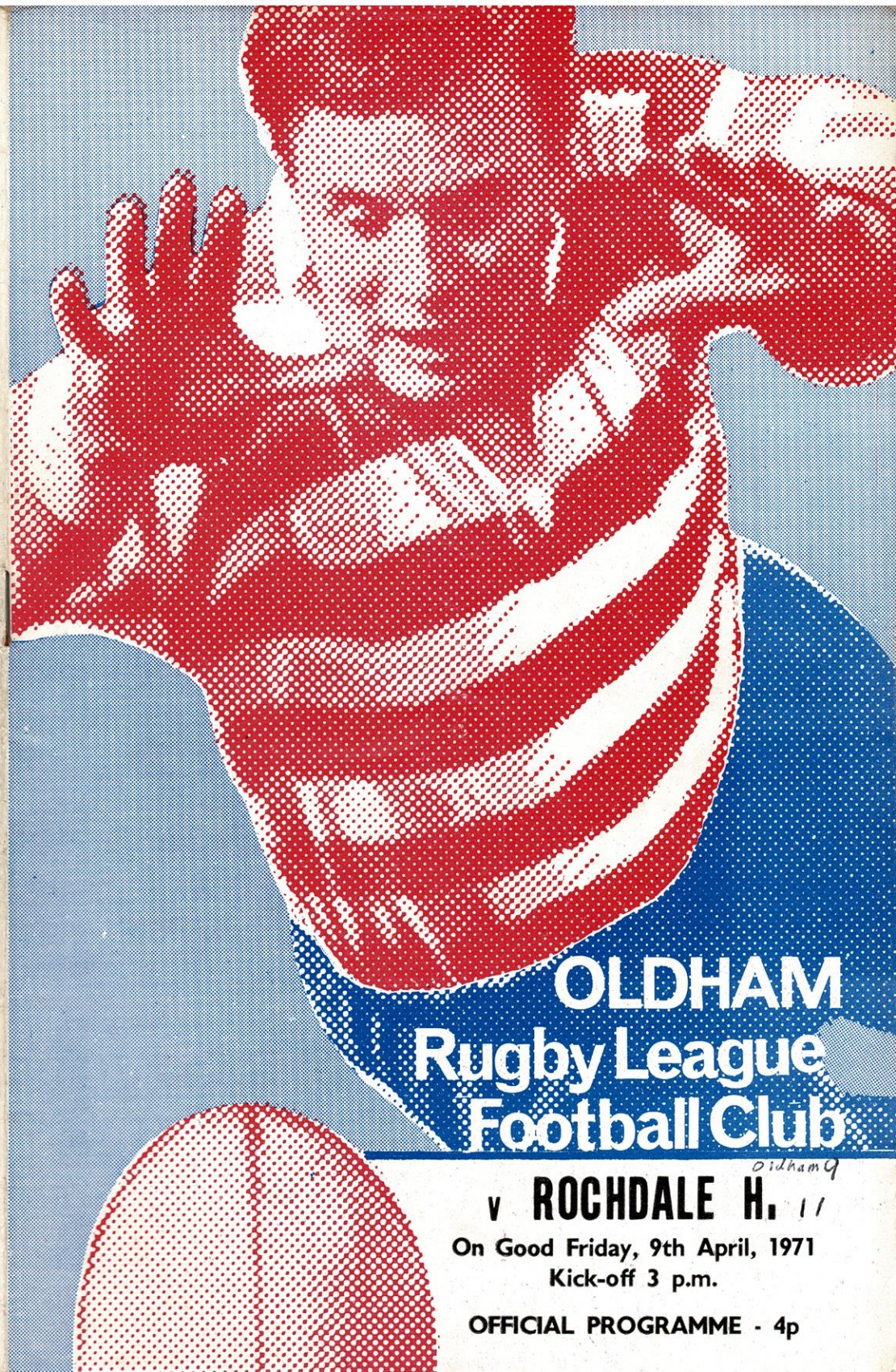

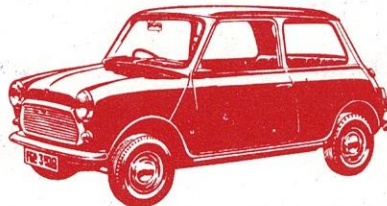

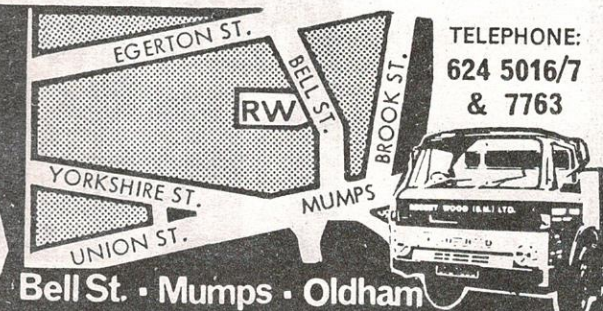

WATERSHEDDINGS NEWS AND VIEWS ...

Today brings us to our last home game of the season. This season has been more successful than last from the playing side and we are hoping for victories in our remaining matches, to ensure our place in the top half of the League, thereby assuring us of better fixtures for next season.

Our team's performances in recent matches have not been too brilliant, having picked up only 4 league points from our last three games.

The 11-4 win against Workington Town, thus completing the double over these worthy opponents, was very commendable, especially in view of Keith Ashcroft's injury (broken ankle), which put him out of the game at half-time, and finished his playing for the rest of the season. Latest news of Keith is that he is back at his job in Wigan Education Offices, and eagerly looking forward to the start of next season.

In contrast, our last home match against Doncaster on March 20th was very poor, and we were a shade lucky to pull off a 9-9 draw, thanks mainly to Phil Larder's 3 goals.

The race is now on to maintain a place in the top half of the League Table. To ensure this, we must go into all three remaining matches determined to win! We are at the time of going to press in fifteenth position, with Dewsbury, York and Bramley hard on our heels. We do not wish to be dependent on teams immediately above us losing matches. As previously stated, we must go all out to win these remaining fixtures.

It is heartening to see our younger players, particularly Jim Reynolds, loose-forward, Johnny Blair, out-half, and Arthur Daley, second-row forward, making such determined bids for regular first-team places, and it won't be long before we are seeing much more of forward Frank Walker, and winger Mike Wilde, who have both been turning in some sterling performances of late in 'A' team matches.

We were very pleased to see Allan Ogden back in action in the 'A' team match v. Rochdale 'A' on March 24th. Unfortunately, Allan sustained an eye injury in this

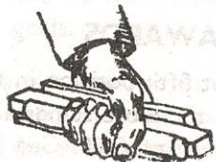

TODAY'S VISITORS

For the final home league match of 1970-71 Rochdale Hornets form the opposition in today's attractive derby match. Oldham coach Graham Starkey had a successful spell with Hornets and in 1966/67 he scored a record 243 points for them. The previous season he captained them in their sixth Lancashire Cup Final. Hornets have won the Lancashire Cup three times, the Lancashire Championship once, and the Rugby League Challenge Cup once, that was in 1962 and was their last previous major trophy victory.

Former Oldham players who are in the present Hornets first team squad include Terry Dolly, who played for Oldham in the 1966 Lancashire Cup Final, and Jim Crellin, the Cumbrian centre. Scrum-half Johnny Hammond is an Oldham lad having been signed from Saint Anne's, who contested the Standard Cup Final at Watersheddings earlier today. Whilst with Saint Anne's, Hammond played for the England Amateur against France. Opposing Hammond for the scrum-half spot is Trevor Rabbitt, who cost £500 when he was signed from Salford in November, 1969. Eddie Tees is a fine and versatile player, who during his career has had spells with Furness R.U.F.C., Roose, York and Barrow, before joining Hornets for £4,000. Although born in Shrewsbury, he has represented Lancashire. Tees has landed over 50 goals this season and kicked one goal for Barrow in the 1967 Cup Final and Henry Delooze landed two. Delooze began his career with Warrington before moving to Barrow and then Rochdale. Prop forward Eddie Brown is having a fine season again playing in the Lancashire team. Two seasons ago he appeared in the England U/24 side. Twenty-three year old Bill Schofield is a recent addition to the Hornets team, having joined them last February in an exchange deal involving Kevin Earle. Winger Jonathan Kucuve arrived at Rochdale from Fiji last January, to join countryman Mike Ratu, and there are two Australians also on Hornets books. These are Colin Reynolds, the Milnrow cricketer, and Bill Gourley.

It has not been a very successful season for Rochdale who have only won 8 of their 31 games so far this season.

When the two sides met at the Athletic Grounds on Boxing Day, a rather snow swept game ended in a 4-4 draw. Oldham led twice, but Eddie Tees was able to equalise two Terry Garrett goals. Last season Oldham recorded a 12-2 home victory, but crashed to an 18-0 defeat at Rochdale and will be determined to erase the memory of that heavy defeat in the best possible way—with a resounding victory.

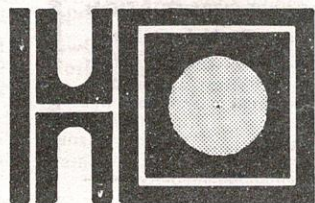
