CLUB NOTES

TO-DAY'S VISITORS.—For our penultimate home game we have pleasure in welcoming Oldham, who earlier in the season scored over 50 points against us when we were represented by the Amateurs of Bisons Sports. However, the Oldham players and officials made sure that the evening was one to be remembered by making everyone most welcome. They come on the very brink of the "Top 16" with 30 points from 31 games played, so will be looking for victory to make sure of a place in the League Play-Offs which commence in two weeks' time.

Their captain-coach is Graham Starkey, who took over at the beginning of the season, after doing similar duty at Huddersfield. Their side is a mixture of youth and experience and we look forward to an enjoyable match this afternoon.

TEAM PROGRESS.—After starting very strongly against Halifax last Saturday and taking a 7-2 lead, once again we failed to consolidate and went down 15-7 in the end. Our performance was very spasmodic; some fine rugby, particularly Cliff Watson's try, interspersed with listless backing up and tackling. The game was marred by a mid-field flare-up resulting in the dismissal of Ken Hepples and Halmshaw, of Halifax. With the injury problem as it is, we are lucky that the next meeting of the Disciplinary Committee is not until the end of the month when our playing season will have finished. With our playing strength weakened by injuries to Griffiths, Maskill, Blake, Crewdson, Charlton and Jarvis, Geoff Gunney was recalled to First-Team duty for our last home game against Barrow. Geoff was making his 561st First-Team appearance, and must surely have created a record unique in Rugby League annals, for his very first game for the Hunslet team was way back in 1951, and here he is in 1971 still serving his only professional club as loyally as ever 20 years later.
