

The next match at Watersheddings is OLDHAM versus WIGAN to be played on Wednesday, 8th September.


COACH'S CORNER

OUR VISITORS

Tonight, for the first time since November 1966, Leeds visit Watersheddings in a League fixture. Oldham supporters have, therefore, the opportunity to watch Rugby League's most attractive combination.

The Leeds line-up is full of star material beginning with full-back John Holmes. Last season he landed 163 goals so it was no surprise when he landed 8 goals and crossed for a try in the 48-3 Lazenby Cup win over Hunslet three weeks ago. Wingers Alan Smith and John Atkinson are both regular selections for Yorkshire and Great Britain. Both toured Australasia in 1970 and were members of last year's World Cup squad as well as appearing in Britain's matches against France last season. Smith was signed from Brookhouse Juniors in 1962, whilst Atkinson joined Leeds from Roundhay R.U.F.C. in 1965. Ron Cowan, a former Scottish and British Lion Rugby Union International, was obtained from Selkirk R.U.F.C. in 1962. Castleford Junior, Les Dyl and John Langley, from Normanton, have the opportunity to clinch a centre position in the absence, through suspension, of Syd Hynes. During the summer Leeds snapped up Alan Hardisty on a free transfer following his release from Castleford, whom he had served since 1958. Hardisty is yet another Yorkshire County and Great Britain star who toured Australasia in both 1966 and 1970. His half-back partner Barry Seabourne, also toured in 1970. An amateur international, Seabourne is a product of Hunslet junior football who has captained England U/24's as well as representing Yorkshire. Another former Hunslet Junior is Bill Ramsey. He represented Great Britain in 1965 before tourning Australasia in 1966 and then being transfered from Hunslet to Leeds in December 1967. Ray Batten joined Leeds from Heworth (York) in February 1963 and has since represented Yorkshire, England and Great Britain. Hooker Tony Fisher was signed by Bradford Northern in November 1964 from R.A.F. Rugby Union. His displays for Wales and on the 1970 tour were noted by Leeds who signed him last November. He was, of course, a member of the World Cup squad as was Bob Haigh. After playing in Wakefield schoolboy and junior leagues, Haigh joined Trinity in September 1962 and quickly made his mark. He played for England U/24's and was selected for the 1968 World Cup. Leeds signed him in April 1970 and last season, his first with Leeds, he crossed for 40 tries, easily a record for tries scored by a forward.

Leeds did not make such an impressive start to this season for, after winning their Charity match with Hunslet for the tenth successive season, they fell to their biggest defeat in five years when Wigan walloped them 36-2. However, they returned to something like their normal form last Tuesday in beating Saint Helens 20-13, so they should provide Oldham with plenty of problems tonight.

KELLETT PROVES HE'S STILL GOT IT

Alan Kellett, one-time Watersheddings wonder boy—now back to whip the current crop of Oldham youngsters into shape as 'A' team player-coach—downed an after-training shandy.

He stretched back in the plush lounge of Oldham's social club and said: "I'm too old to play regular senior rugby. I enjoy training and playing—but there's a vast gulf between first and 'A' team football.

"In any case, Graham (senior coach Graham Starkey) wants youth in the first team and I agree with him that this is the right policy."

Kellett, a Halifax lad, made his name at Oldham around players like Alan Davies, Frankie Pitchford and Derek Turner.

He went on to play with Halifax, Bradford Northern, and Keighley, holding coaching appointments at Odsal and Lawkholme Lane before returning to Watersheddings in the summer.

He is clearly going to be content with developing the players of tomorrow.

"My job is with the 'A' team," he said, "and that's the job I want to do."

But Oldham fans are going to take some convincing that 33-year-old Kellett hasnt got the puff left to drag on the first team Oldham jersey that he last wore in 1963.

Since I had that interview with Alan, he has guided the 'A' team to victory and proved that what he lacks in the legs he compensates for with brain and football skills.

Against Salford 'A' he began at full-back, but with Oldham behind at half-time he moved up to loose-forward and his side suddenly began to click.

His great distribution set up two tries, and he marshalled the side superbly.

Then, the game stitched up, he reverted to full-back to let his pack have a go on their own.

"If that lad can't walk into this Oldham side, I'll do a jig on Tommyfield Market," said one fan.

"I'd play him in one of four positions," chanted another. "Full-back, stand-off, centre or loose-forward."

The reference to playing Kellett at full-back was no slight on one of the team's fastest and most consistent performers—tousle-haired Martin Murphy.

The Watersheddings own "Murph" is just about in a class of his own—and the fan's idea was to get the best out of him by pushing him up to one of the half-back positions.

The permutations are many, and I would be reluctant to weaken one position to strengthen another.

But the fans are united on one theme—more skills, brains, and pace are needed behind Oldham's pack.
