



Joe Collins and Trevor Buckley, two local signings, make up the three quarter line, Tug Wilson, a stalwart scrummager, is expected to be at open side prop forward, with either Dick Bonser or Frank Walker on the blind side, hooking will be Colin Bowden who is reported to have had a good game at Leeds and displaces the more renowned under-24 international Kevin Taylor. In the second row are likely to be Bob Irving who toured Australia in the summer of 1970 and Billy Churm the former Warrington loose forward, completing the side will be loose forward Ray Clark who has recently been playing ing on the wing.

Graham Starkey, after a season of injuries last year, appears to have hung up his boots to concentrate on the coaching of the Club.

He was one of many who have raised this question, which is answered in full on page 51 of the history booklet. The quotation is:-

"1921 (September) - Hornets changed their colours from green and black to red, white and blue, because green and black 'did not come out of the weekly wash as nicely as they might have done'. The Hornets played in green and black again for the first time for 26 years on 13th December, 1947, against Wigan, using the colours occasionally when clashing with opponents".

Incidentally my beloved Fieldhead, where I spent many happy hours as a boy on the ground off Walker Street, also played in green and black shirts.


