



OUR VISITORS

Tonight Oldham face the mammoth task of trying to bridge a 26 point gap if they are to visit Salford in the next stage of the BBC 2 Floodlit Cup. Whilst Oldham were not exactly on top form when they visited Rochdale, credit must not be taken from a much improved Rochdale team.

Since the arrival of player coach Frank Myler, Hornets have been revitalised, not only by the capture of several new players but the improved form of the more established members of the Hornets squad such as full-back Joe Chamberlain. He joined Rochdale in November 1964 from Woolston juniors and this season looks like being his best, for against Barrow in the Lancashire Cup, Chamberlain crossed for two tries and also kicked two goals. Hornets can also boast about their two speedy wingers. Mike Ratu and Norman Brelsford. A Fijian, Ratu was signed from Stroud R.U.F.C., whilst Brelsford will need very little introduction to Oldham supporters for he had a short spell at Watersheddings before moving to the Athletic Grounds. When not speeding down the wing, Brelsford can be seen speeding around the Social Club, pursuing his other occupation as a taxi driver. Playing in the centre is another former Oldham player, Jim Crellin. Oldham signed Crellin from Workington Town and then transfered him to Rochdale for £850. Last season Crellin kicked 20 goals for Hornets and also crossed for 10 tries. Willie Aspinall has proved to be a most astute signing despite the fact that he broke a couple of fingers on his first outing for Hornets. Aspinall joined Warrington in 1962 and quickly came to prominence for he toured Australasia in 1966 as well as being a member of the Lancashire team. Rochdale parted with a cheque for £2,000 when they signed him last July. Player coach Frank Myler, who joined Hornets at the end of last season has enjoyed a most successful career in rugby league since he joined Widnes in 1956. After 11 years at Widnes he moved to Saint Helens before transfering to Hornets. Myler's career spans numerous appearances for Lancashire, 23 test matches, two World Cup series (1960 and 1970) and two tours to Australia in 1966 and 1970. He captained Great Britain on both the 1970 tour and the World Cup series, and throughout his career he has proved to be a model sportsman both on and off the field. At scrum-half is another former Saint Helens player, Peter Gartland, who also joined Rochdale during the summer for £500. In the forwards too, Hornets have shown considerable improvement. At prop could be any two of Mike Watson, Peter Birchall and Eddie Brown. Watson was formerly with Barrow and Blackpool Borough, whilst Rochdale born England U/24 player Peter Birchall was signed from Huddersfield. Former Mayfield prop, Eddie Brown is another England U/24 international, whose form this season has resulted in a flood of enquiries from the more wealthy clubs who are keen to secure his services.

Bob Welding also played in that match and again tonight he is in the Lancashire team which meets Yorkshire at Leigh. One of the most under-rated hookers in the league is Peter Clarke, the former Latchford Albion player. Other Warrington junior league signings are Tony Cooke and George Snape, both of whom came from Woolston. Another forward who cost Rochdale nothing is Kevin Flanagan, the 23 year old who was obtained on a free transfer from Oldham. Last February, Hornets signed Bill Sheffield from Saint Helens in an exchange deal involving Kevin Earle and he, too, is improving with each outing. Yet another former Warrington junior is Henry Delooze but Hornets signed him from Barrow after previously playing for Warrington. Whilst at Barrow, Delooze played at Wembley and kicked 2 goals in his side's 17-12 defeat by Featherstone. Also on the fringe of a first team spot is Alan Hodkinson, the Leigh born lad who was signed from Salford.

As can be seen from previous results this Hornets outfit is settling down very well together and no doubt they will again form stiff opposition for the Watersheddings combination.




