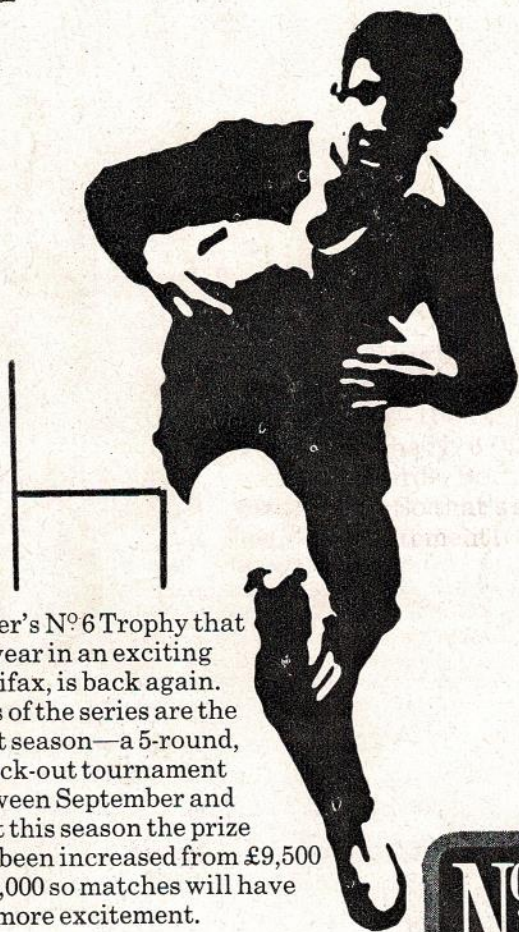


Back again for another great season!

If there is one game on the Hornets' fixture programme which is guaranteed to arouse interest, provoke arguments, create discussion, it is the one against our neighbours and old rivals from six miles away—Oldham, our visitors to the Athletic Grounds this afternoon.

To many people, on both sides of Buckstones, this is THE game of the season. Hornets versus Oldham. What memories! Crowds of anything between 15,000 and 20,000 packed the Athletic Grounds and Watersheddings in the fifties when such as Alan Davies, Frank Pitchford and Derek Turner on the one side and Norman Short, Les Jones, Johnny Fishwick and Ted Cahill on the other produced monumental clashes.

Sadly, the days of the big crowds are gone, only temporarily, one hopes, but the two present teams are still capable of turning on a tip-top display and treating the fans to a super spectacle.

Astute buying, allied to the shrewd coaching of ex-Hornet Graham Starkey, has seen Oldham storm back to somewhere near the top of the Rugby League table. No one is more pleased than we at the Athletic Grounds to see Oldham back as a power in the game once more.

On their day Oldham are one of the most attractive sides in the game. They have struggled a bit recently with defeats against St Helens, Leigh and Salford, but hit form again last Sunday to bring back the points from Dewsbury—not the easiest thing to do these days.

Helping Oldham to that win was recent signing Albert Halsall, who moved to Watersheddings from Station Road last week. We were once interested in signing Halsall and eventually decided to move for Bill Holliday. We have benefited by signing Holliday and we hope that Halsall has a successful stay with Oldham.

Borth Hornets and Oldham had games on Christmas Eve, so what the teams will be today will be announced over our public address system.

If the two teams have steered clear of injuries the fight for the points should be very interesting, with Hornets hoping to avenge that 9-2 defeat Oldham inflicted here last March.

Oldham have men in form. Wingman Norman Hodgkinson is running in tries at regular intervals—he had 18 at the last count—and centre Phil Larder looks well on the way to repeating last season's haul of 100-plus goals.

FAMOUS DUMMIES (Continued)

In the last programme I recalled the story of some famous dummies as recounted in the "Liverpool Evening Express" 37 years ago. Here is a further extract from "Lancastrian's" article:—

5,000 YELLED "FORWARD!"

Ernie Shaw treasures the memory of a "dummy" almost unique. The old Runcorn-Wigan St Helens-Widnes forward had, by means of such efforts, made a reputation in Yorkshire unsurpassed even by the mighty Gallagher himself.

He had deliberately acquired an apparent clumsiness in giving a "dummy" that left no possible doubt in the watcher's mind that he was giving the average pass of the average forward—whereas in reality Shaw had hands like a threequarter.

On this especial occasion Shaw was near the Hull line. He snapped up a loose ball, with the Hull fullback only a couple of yards away. One of Shaw's colleagues was near, but he could not help, as he was standing five yards offside in front of Shaw, right on the Hull line.

Then Shaw, to beat the fullback, did what seemed the craziest thing imaginable. He actually passed the ball, with a great two-armed swing, to the man in front of him.

Five thousand, with a single thought, yelled as one man "Forward!" It was the silliest-looking pass in history and as the crowd thus yelled for the "forward pass," Referee Harding simultaneously blew his whistle, of course.

Meanwhile, Shaw had sauntered over the line for a try, "with the ball tucked underneath his arm." Alas, for his genius! His "dummy" had been so marvellous in its perfection that it had deceived every person on the ground, referee included; and Shaw had to come back for a "forward pass" in which the ball had never left his hands.

Shaw feigned deep indignation over the incident; but in the depths of Ernie's heart, I am certain that he was more pleased that the referee had been hoodwinked, as well as the opposition, than if he had been credited with the try he had undoubtedly scored.

Anyhow, Shaw smiled a highly satisfied smile when Referee Harding humorously remarked to him, after the match: "If you ever give a 'dummy' like that again, Ernie, I shall order you off."

outing the Supporters Club committee enjoyed almost 20 years ago—on 21 November 1953 to be exact. I make no apologies for recounting in full from the "Rochdale Observer" the story of that trip. I have never seen a "pub" as packed in my life as the Junction Hotel at Featherstone was on that memorable day. You have read in this programme stories of prowess on the field—now read how the backroom boys of 20 years ago "performed!"

GOOD FEELING AMONG SUPPORTERS

An example of the good feeling and co-operation which exists between supporters' clubs in the Rugby League was evident on Saturday when 27 members of the Hornets Supporters' Club committee visited Featherstone. After the game the Rochdale party joined the Featherstone Supporters' Club committee and friends at the Junction Hotel, which is the headquarters of the Rugby Football Club and where "mine host" is a former Featherstone half-back, Mr G Johnson. Seventy people sat down to tea, and the Rochdale contingent were given a warm welcome by the Rovers Supporters' Club chairman, Mr G A Whitehead, who suggested that the event be made an annual affair.

Replying, Mr R D Fletcher (Hornets Supporters' Club secretary) said that Featherstone was an automatic choice when the subject of a committee trip of that nature was first suggested, for affinity was felt with a club like that at Featherstone, because their work matched what they at Rochdale were trying to do. Mr C Canham (Rochdale chairman) supported the secretary's remarks and thanked the Featherstone committee for the wonderful welcome they had given to the visitors.

Games, including snooker, and a concert followed. Miss M Trafford acted as pianist. Other Featherstone artistes contributing to the programme were Messrs G Jeffrey and C Thompson (vocalists) and Mr Bert Lowe (humorist). Of the Rochdale party Messrs J F Law (illusionist) and R Brierley (vocalist) made their contribution to the evening's entertainment. Mr E Chapman (secretary of the Featherstone Rovers Supporters' Club) made the tea and concert arrangements, and a visitor during the evening was Mr Harry Sunderland, the Rugby League writer and former Australian Rugby League Tour manager.
