

OPINION

Boro were certainly in the news last weekend but not, unfortunately for having gained a victory. The transfer market was busy with first Terry Cassidy moving to his home club Wigan, next Tom Warburton unexpectedly signed for Widnes closely followed by Alan Bishop being taken on trials by the same side. As they no longer had their hearts in matches played by Boro recently these transactions will benefit both Club and player but it now leaves the team even more depleted of experience. Indeed only 5 of last season's team now remain and of these Graham Seddon was a comparative late signing.

Compare last Sunday's team with that which opened the season against Batley; Cadman; Johnson, Warburton, Cassidy Kollios; Marsh, Bishop; Loughlin, Farrell, Gundry, Walker, Hall, Seddon; Jackson, Egan, and it can be seen that only 4 of the 15 now remain. Six of these have been transferred to other clubs, Jackson (Barrow), Farrel and Hall (Oldham), plus the 3 previously mentioned and 3 other former regulars are still on offer, Darbyshire, Marsh and Martland. Many fans say that so many players should not have been transferred but have the results really been that much worse with the inclusion of so many youngsters? Refer again to the 3 opening fixtures and reflect that Boro's teams contained fully experienced players with perhaps 3 exceptions. With results such as these something in period should take place. Surprisingly morale at present is not at the expected low ebb but a win before the close would be of immense value to their confidence.

There will probably be 2 or 3 new additions by today's game but at the time 'of writing names cannot be revealed.

Last Sunday saw another defeat which would have been higher but for some extraordinary goal attempts. The Boro were outclassed but not demoralised and showed signs of good attacking play but, again, lack of penetration was all too obvious. The fact that the half-time score was only 2-17 was a source of wonder as the Lions won every scrum. The second period showed some slight improvement but the leadership of an old head was sadly lacking. New skipper Joe Egan kicked the lone goal and now has a 50 per cent. success rate, 2 from 4 attempts! One sour note was the use of some tactics adopted by the visitors
