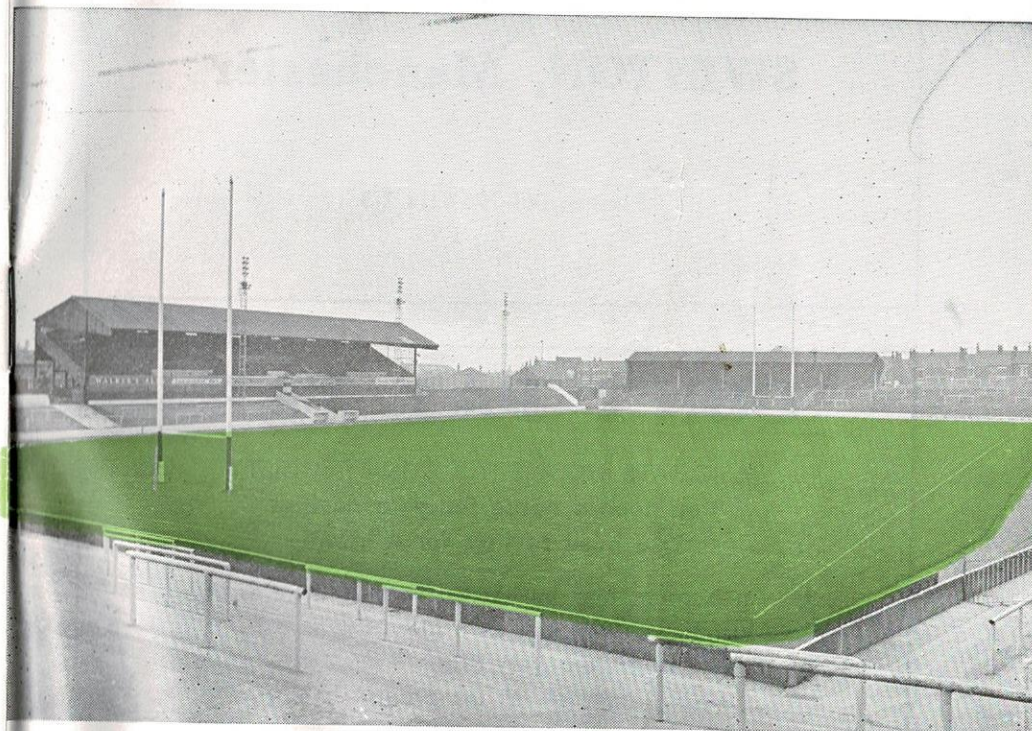

Oldham are among the growing number of clubs who want to see the timekeeping system abolished after a season's trial.

Changing the rules so frequently over the past seasons has done considerable harm to the image of the game generally.

But fans and officials alike are now wondering whether it was a wise step to take the timekeeping out of the referee's control.

We have had at least two instances of games being played five minutes short, one involving teams separated by a mere two points at the time.

Then, with the human element creeping in, there have been times when referees have forgotten to signal the stoppages when a player has been injured.

Unfortunately several clubs have not helped the new system by having inadequate hooters or bells and we have had instances of touch judges frantically trying to inform referees of the time.

But the most worrying feature—and one that presented itself in the first Cup semi-final at Headingley—is that of the referee ending the game on the hooter without waiting for the play to become dead.

Referee Sam Shepherd was placed in a difficult position when fans poured on at the sound of the hooter, engulfing the players on the pitch.

But the consequences could be serious in a close game, as Oldham secretary Kevin Wilkinson claims.

"We are concerned with what happens when a player is taking a kick at goal and the fans invade the pitch as soon as they hear the hooter," he says.

"There could also be the situation of a player running for the line and suddenly confronted by fans.

"This is the main reason we would like to see the system revert to the referee handling the timekeeping again."

But former top referee Eric Clay, now a Castleford director, takes opposite views.

"I think it is a good system," he says. "It takes a lot of weight off referees. It has already proved that more time is wasted than we had imagined.

"But what I personally would like to see is more former touch judges being brought in, making the job an official one with records being kept and sent to League headquarters.

"Now that that age limit has been trimmed from 55 to 50 there must be plenty of touch judges—some are already involved—eager to help in this capacity."

It is an interesting thought and I am sure we have not heard the last of this subject.

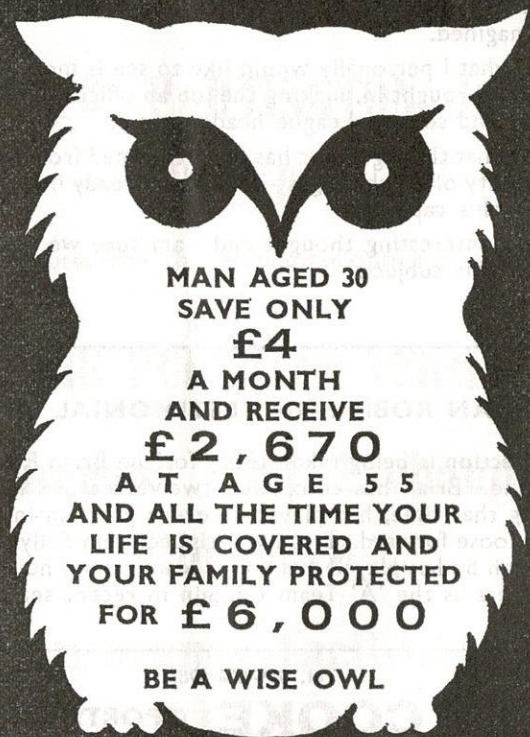
