

Hello Again

Fresh in everyones mind is the visit to Headingley last Saturday Only the most superb of optimists would have gambled on a win. In retrospect, however, the most heartening feature of the afternoon was the number of folk showing the Green and White who made the short journey. It would be hard going against Leeds' side with 13 men on the field but to play them shorthanded for two thirds of the game was something that proved far too much for our lads. We see in the Press that bad temper and ill feeling crept into the game, and it is a pity that two or three minutes isolated folly received so much publicity. Phil Horrocks received his marching orders from one of the leading referees. Mick Naughton, and perhaps he would not have received such a drastic penalty had not all the players received a general warning a few minutes earlier. The referee's decision, however, is final and such warning has to be obeyed. We always take pride in Rugby League in maintaining that our players do not behave like soccer players in their atti-

tude to referees and we were, of course, very shaken to note some of the incidents that happened in the game. Phil will have to pay the penalty but we hope that the lesson will be learnt by all. The big talking point at Headingley, however, was the brilliance of their backs and their superb running, though the performance of our skipper, Geoff Crewdson, for though a veteran, his enthusiasm and ability shone throughout the game and the two tries he scored were just reward for his effort. His performance indicated that age is no substitute for competence and fitness. Only a little way behind was Jimmy Crampton who, despite appearing in a wrongly numbered jersey, turned in a inspired display of tackling and running. He caught the eye on many occasions with his quick, low, tackling and his superb fitness. Jimmy is all "go" and it is to be hoped that others do not leave the burden of tackling all to him. full teams there would have been a closer score.

A crowd of over 4,000 was the highest on the Saturday, though well below expectations. In other years the battle between the rival teams attracted five figure gates but it seems now that it will be some time before the crowds will roll up. Whether any blame can be attached to the televised match at the West side of Leeds is debatable but it does seem significant that those clubs who played on the Sunday had more people through the turnstiles. When we are told that Bramley had less than 750 for their televised match against Hull surely it cannot be in the interest of the B.B.C. to televise a match with so few spectators. The millions who watched would hardly be impressed by the atmosphere, or lack of it. We did suggest to Leeds that they play the match on Sunday, but their policy is to play on Saturdays and they were not prepared to alter. The Leeds chairman said that if they played on Sunday their crowd would "boycott" the game. It seems to us that many of their supporters must have boycotted it in any event. There are many people in the game coming round to the view that it is the supporters on the terraces that count and that the future of the game depends upon their presence and not on the 'stay at home' viewers.

We have made it clear that our main objective this season is to get into the top four of the Second Division and so gain promotion, and it has been heartening to have a draw at each of our performances away from home, particularly the one at Leigh, for they appear to be running away with the Second Division championship.

We made the long journey to Barrow and, with the wind behind us, quickly took the advantage and had 13 points on the board, without reply. was making his debut after having been purchased from Wigan for £4,000. Our forwards got a 2—1 advantage in the scrums and Bob Gatley took advantage of this with an aggressive attacking display. Bob was never frightened of trying the unorthodox and his frequent bursts and kicking always had Barrow in difficulties.

We genuinely believe that most of our supporters are fully behind the management and the team, but we do get one or two complaints. Whilst we are endeavouring to strengthen the team there is a shortage of talent and many clubs who we have approached for players have turned us down flat. The team manager is only interested in players who are better than those we have and who can strengthen the team squad and to get these players is more easily said than done. Obviously we cannot name the clubs we have approached or the players we have requested but we must make it clear that we are on the lookout. Most clubs do not want to part with established first team players and money does

not even seem to tempt them. An indication of how difficult is the transfer market can be seen by our neighbours, Leeds. At the time New Hunslet was formed they obtained for nothing, from the Parkside Register, a second row forward, Phil Sanderson. Phil never made the Leeds first team regularly and this season does not appear to have even been in the second team. Leeds put him on the transfer list, the asking figure was £2,500. If they get that sum it would show a handsome profit, but the point we are making is that by putting him on the list at such a high price it is virtually keeping him out of the game. We hope they do get £2.500 but it would have been a nice gesture if their Chairman had said to us "look Phil Sanderson does not feature in our plans, he cost us nothing. he might do you some good, do you want him?" One thing our inexperienced management have realised quickly is that you get very few favours in this game and more is the pity, for the quicker clubs realise that prosperity and success depends upon overall co-operation the

All professional clubs are having difficulty and we feel that there is a need now for closing the ranks and pursuing the policy of togetherness without delay.

One of the grumbles, and we are pleased to say it is only from a very few people, concerns the charge for entry to the indicator stand. We are charging 10p and for that coin the spectator can stand on the terraces, take a seat in the stand or stand at the back. The spectator enjoys the facilities of a comfortable. heated bar and we feel that the price is reasonable, particularly in comparison with other clubs. A club has to pay, it cannot continually exist on directors putting their hands in their pockets. To take £200 at the turnstiles and to pay winning money for the first and second team that week and winning pay for the subsequent away match does not make economic sense. To these supporters therefore, who want a winning and successful team we can only say that they will have to bear with us in appreciating financial problems. We have no intention of fleecing the customer but we do get a little annoved at the supporter who tells us to go out and spend thousands and yet wants his Rugby for next to nothing. During the close season, as you all know, we spent thousands of pounds on the playing area and on the flood-lighting system. These amenities are for the benefit of the supporter and we genuinely hope that they will understand this and not grumble about the small charge being made. Enough of these grumbles for they are addressed only to a few and let us for a minute pay tribute to the majority of supporters who regularly and faithfully attend the matches both home and away and make the job appear to be worth-
