## WELCOME TO OLDHAM . . .

For this afternoon's "warm-up" to next weekend's R.L. Cup tough 2nd round clash with Bradford Northern, we welcome equally difficult opposition in the form of our good friends from Oldham.

We are very pleased to have Oldham's players, officials and supporters at Hilton Park for this 2nd division clash which should be an exciting, entertaining affair.

Oldham are now going great guns at the top of the 2nd Division and are hopeful of promotion back into the upper ranks next season.

They began this season's campaign rather shakily but, after their slow start, they have settled down into one of the division's better sides, under the guidance of former St. Helens & Great Britain coach, Jim Challinor.

At full-back is Martin Murphy, who recently made his 1st appearance for England after many seasons classed as the best uncapped full-back in the League. Murphy, an ex Astley & Tyldesley R.L. amateur, gained useful experience 'guesting' in Australia for the summer.

Goal-kicker of the side is ex-Sale R.U. star Phil Larder, who has been regular centre for Oldham for several seasons.

The other regular centre is former Leeds favourite, and now a popular Watersheddings player, Tony Wainwright.

Welshman Mike Elliott, signed from Cwmellyn R.U. club over 11 years ago, is playing well on the wing, running with determination and always looking for tries.

Former Fairwater R.U. player Chris O'Brien and transfer-listed Ian Holland, the goal-kicking ex-Salford starlet, are also wingers.

Stand-off is David Treasure, ex-York and Bradford, currently in superb form and an integral part of the Oldham revival.

His half-back partner is clever little scrum-half Mick McCone, ex-Doncaster.

Four young backs who Oldham have a lot of hope for are strong running winger Steve Lund, full-back Gordon Pollard who comes from the Huddersfield area, centre Ian Taylor and Geoff Munro, the latter signed from Oldham 'B'.

Hooker Kevin Taylor, signed at 16 from local club Werneth, has made over 400 1st team appearances in his 12 seasons with Oldham.

Other forwards are local Fred Hall, a prop who began his professional career with Blackpool, useful prop Brian Hughes, stand-in goal-kicker Johnny Blair, an ex-Oldham junior, prop Ray Hicks who had trials at Leigh some time ago, 17-years-old Castleford based 2nd rower Paul Starbuck, Gareth Owen, former Tyldesley R.U. ace and son of ever-popular Stan Owen, Wigan based loose forward Johnny Farrell and free-transfer man Dickie Brown who has established himself firmly in the 2nd row with some good performances.

Castleford director Ronnie Simpson is a loyal tyke but has adapted to the role of a Welshman with rare enthusiasm since being appointed team manager of Wales.

He has been on the Castleford board for 25 years, including 15 as vice-chairman or chairman, and last summer ended his two-years stint as chairman of the Rugby League Council.

Mr. Simpson, who has seen the Wheldon Road club rise from the ranks of strugglers to become one of the most respected teams in the game, is confident that the Welsh start will be at the top.

Since his appointment much of his time has been spent travelling around the League checking on the 54 players who are Welsh born or have suddenly discovered they have traces of the 'Dragon's Blood' in their veins.

Some of the names were, of course, well-known and one or two others were surprising, to say the least, but Mr. Simpson diligently checked each one

He says: "The choice we had was tremendous, when you think we can afford to pick a player like Maurice Richards as sub. Certainly some of the names that cropped up must have knocked England's chances back a bit.

"There is a good deal of experience in the pack and a lot of class in the backs, a great combination. I am really looking forward to the challenge".

Mr. Simpson, who was with the successful 1972 Great Britain World Cup team in France, added: "There was never any question of the Welsh being there just to make up the numbers.

"We had slight doubts about the half-backs but when Peter Banner turned out to be available that was that. All we ask now is to be able to select from strength.

"I'm sure when these lads put on the red jersey of Wales there'll be no need to motivate them; the spirit will be there before we start, and the rest had better watch out, I'm not frightened of taking this team anywhere".

It is a fair warning to the other countries and Mr. Simpson adds another "Naturally, I'm a Yorkshireman, but I'm a Rugby League man at heart and I don't mind changing nationalities for a few months to bring the Welsh team back to life".

## THE GREEN GREEN GRASS OF 'HILTON PARK'

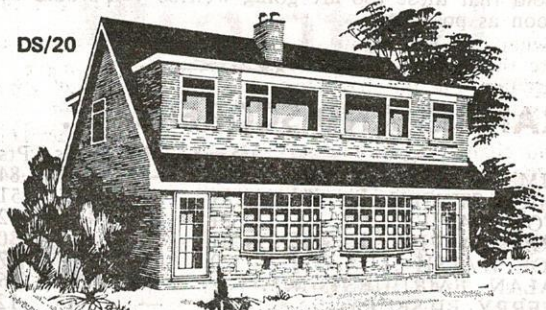
Although we have not been able to boast too much about the performances of the team during this year it can be said that we have something to boast about in the condition of our playing area, which continues to be one of the best in the game.
